

January: Phone Every One Day Connect with Your Nonresident Sisters

Founders' Day (January 21, 2018) is the perfect time to connect with your nonresident members. Here are a few suggestions you might use to make sure these members know how much they are loved and valued, even though they live too far away to participate regularly in chapter life:

FaceTime: following a meeting in January, use Apple technology to call your nonresident sister and talk face-to face.

Road trip: if your nonresident sister lives close enough, plan a day trip. Ask to meet her at the restaurant of her choice for lunch, or another venue where a group of you can gather to chat and catch up. **Skype call**: if visiting in person isn't feasible, investigate other ways to visually connect, such as Skype or Google chat. Involve as many sisters as possible on the call. If she's willing, use the technology to have her "attend" a chapter program.

As the opportunity presents itself, remind these sisters that even though you love them, it's perfectly acceptable for them to transfer their membership to a nearby chapter where they can fully participate in P.E.O. life.
