Programming idea: The Connection Web

To illustrate the connectivity of sisters from our newest to our collegiate to our charter members, bring a ball of yarn to the meeting. As your chapter stands in a circle, start by explaining how we all have our unique traits but we also share commonalities. Begin by sharing things about yourself (places you've lived, sports you enjoy). As a chapter member hears something she has in common with you, she will say "that's our connection" and you toss the ball of yarn to her holding onto the end. She then shares about herself and the ball continues to be tossed with each one holding onto the yarn before tossing, creating a web. When all have participated, the leader should tie it all together with a statement about the missing sisters and our promise to support and love them.
