#### **MEMBERSHIP MOMENT – Getting to Know You**

Here is a fun activity that will help you to get better acquainted with the sisters in your chapter. It's called "Spotlight Sisters." At each meeting during Suggestions for the Good of the Chapter, turn the spotlight on one P.E.O. sister and have her tell about herself, her life, her unusual hobbies or travels, etc. She might even include some little-known facts about herself. The social chairman can arrange who that sister will be ahead of time so she will be well prepared. You might learn some very fun facts about sisters you thought you knew, as well as hear all about newer members of your chapter. Getting to know your chapter sisters is a very important part of showing loving concern.

### Every Sister Is a V.I.P. (Very Important P.E.O.) What to Do with Your Inactive List

Most chapters have a list of inactive members – sisters who have not paid their dues and no longer have the privilege of attending business meetings. But these sisters are P.E.O.s for a lifetime, and that means they are still V.I.P.s (Very Important P.E.O.s). Maintaining an accurate list of your inactive members and their contact information is a very important part of expressing a loving concern for each sister.

One of the chapter president's duties is to ask the corresponding secretary to read the list of inactive members in February. This should already have happened in your chapter in preparation for the annual reports that were submitted in March. Now it is time to clean up those lists and make sure the contact information is correct. A good way to do this is to assign chapter members to call each of the inactive members and report any incorrect information.

The instruction to corresponding secretaries says that "members who on March 1 have been inactive for 25 years and have not been heard from within a reasonable number of years and/or whose whereabouts are unknown shall be reported LC (lost contact) on the Annual Report of Corresponding Secretary (ARCS)."

It is a good idea to repeat reading this list at least once more during the year to make sure their information is correct for the next annual report.

Even more important than obtaining correct information is staying connected with these sisters and letting them know we care about them. These sisters are worth the effort – remember, once a P.E.O. always a P.E.O.
