It's Okay to Talk about P.E.O.

Be Prepared with Your Elevator Speech

You are on your way home from your P.E.O. meeting and make a stop at the market to pick up groceries. While you are picking out produce, a woman standing beside you notices your pretty pin and asks, "What does your pin represent?"

Or you are out for a meal after your meeting and the server takes notice that you are all wearing the same pin. "What is P.E.O.?" she asks.

In both of these situations and many similar scenarios, you have just a moment to share all the amazing things that comprise the P.E.O. Sisterhood. Would one of these questions catch you off guard? Do you know what you would say? It might be well worth giving this some thought so you are ready and feel at ease talking about P.E.O. with nonmembers.

It is easy to become comfortable talking about P.E.O. with a little practice. An elevator speech is a clear, brief message or "commercial" about your subject. The idea behind having an elevator speech is that you are prepared to share this information with anyone, at any time, in the time it takes people to ride from the top to the bottom of a building in an elevator.

A sample P.E.O. elevator speech is included in the <u>P.E.O. Media Guide</u>, available on the P.E.O. website in the Brand Resource Center > Communication Tools.

As membership chairman, schedule time for your chapter to create and practice their own P.E.O. elevator speech. You'll have fun and be ready the next time someone asks "What is P.E.O.?"
