Rules of Convention

Adopted by International
For Virtual Convention of Colorado State Chapter
Rules for 2021 Virtual Conventions

Of State, Provincial and District Chapters

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, the Executive Board of International Chapter adopted the following rules for all 2021 virtual conventions of State, Provincial and District Chapters. These rules may not be amended.

A virtual convention for state, provincial and district chapters will be divided into two or more meetings. The opening meeting will contain all agenda items of business which require action by vote of members of convention. A second and subsequent meeting will contain only agenda items of business not requiring any action during convention.

General Rules

- 1. A webcam video of the president shall be displayed throughout the convention.
- 2. A webcam video of a presenter may be displayed throughout the convention, if available.
- 3. Each voting member must have the contemporaneous ability during the opening meeting to submit a vote or ballot through the video platform's polling process on an individual device. Each voting member is limited to one device.

- 4. Each voting member of convention must be situated in a private location and shall be responsible for her connection to the Internet. No action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of, a member's individual connection prevented her from participating in the meeting.
- 5. Members' devices shall remain muted unless recognized to speak. A Technical Support specialist will operate the mute/unmute function.
- 6. A committee appointed by the president from voting members of convention has the responsibility to read and approve the minutes of convention.
- 7. Members shall not record any portion of the business meetings, take screen shots or photos of presentations or slides, or post/share on the Internet, unless notified that this rule is suspended.
- 8. Amendments to state, provincial and district chapter bylaws and standing rules adopted at convention will take effect at the close of convention and as instructed in the bylaws.

Rules for Opening Meeting

- 1. Only voting members of convention as defined in the state, provincial or district chapter bylaws, designated participants and technical support specialists shall attend the opening meeting.
- 2. Voting members of convention shall register for the opening meeting using a specific registration link and will be verified when logging in to the platform.

- 3. Only voting members of convention shall sign in as **attendees** and maintain internet access when present throughout the opening meeting but sign out upon any permanent departure prior to adjournment. In the event a delegate must leave the remainder of the convention, the alternate shall register and be approved by the Credentials Committee.
- 4. Once a quorum is established in the opening meeting, the continued presence of a quorum shall be monitored by the online list of participants unless another quorum count is ordered by the president or convention. The list will be copied for the proceedings of convention.
- 5. Nominations "from the floor" shall be submitted in writing to the president and chairman of the Nominating Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention in order to give the Nominating Committee time to verify the candidate meets the eligibility requirements and to gain her consent to be nominated.
- 6. The Chairman of Amendments and Recommendation Committee will read only the explanation provided for all proposed amendments.
- 7. Proposed amendments presented "as a block" are voted upon as one without debate and a single vote. A request for information on any of the items is allowed and a member may request an amendment be pulled from the block for separate consideration and vote. A request to pull an amendment shall be submitted in writing to the president and chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention.
- 8. In the interest of time and for clear communication, a member intending to introduce a main motion or offer a motion to amend to any business that has been noticed prior to convention shall submit it in writing to the president and chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations

Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention.

- 9. To seek recognition to speak, a member shall click "Q&A" in the Webinar controls and enter her name, chapter letter(s) or title, and indicate purpose: PRO, CON, Request for Information. A queue of speakers is electronically established for each motion and the queue will be cleared when the motion is disposed of. The president will alternate between those speaking pro and con. Priority recognition is given to a Request for Information.
- 1. A member addressing the president shall state her name, chapter letter(s) or title and purpose. A member will be limited to speak once for one (1) minute on each motion. Total time clock on a proposed amendment or resolution shall be limited to seven (7) minutes. Items considered seriatim shall be limited to four (4) minutes per amendment within the group with an additional two (2) minutes allowed for the group as a whole.

If a motion to amend is presented pursuant to Rule #16, the total time clock will be paused, and a five (5) minute time limit will be set for consideration of the motion to amend. Upon disposition of the motion to amend, the president will restart the total time clock and resume consideration of the pending motion.

A question asked under a request for information is not counted as individual debate time but does count toward the total time clock for the amendment. The clock for an individual to answer will pause for the time required to respond to a request for information and as ordered by the president.

- 2. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, the approved method of voting is by ballot taken electronically by Zoom polling. The president shall announce the result.
- 3. A total time of 45 seconds will be given to complete voting on each Zoom poll.
- 4. All items of business which require action by vote of members of convention shall be contained within the scheduled opening meeting.

MINUTES

OPENING MEETINGSaturday, June 5, 2021

The 118th Annual Convention of Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood convened at 7:00 a.m., Saturday, June 5, 2021, through full-featured internet meeting services.

The meeting was called to order by President Shari Fox at 7:00 a.m.

The president welcomed all attendees and thanked the many sisters who have made the 2020-2021 year memorable and remarkable for all of us.

President Shari Fox called on Sandy Renner, JH, PSPCSC, chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee, to assist with conducting a practice vote.

The first Credentials Report was given by chairman Stephanie Oldland, PSP CSC, Chapter BA/CO.

Chairman Stephanie Oldland reported 289 members of convention entitled to vote. Stephanie Oldland moved, and it was seconded that the report be adopted. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 252 votes cast, 127 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 233 pro and 19 con. The report was adopted.

Quorum was established through a poll taken to verify a majority of local chapter representation.

Attention was called to the Rules of Convention as adopted by the Executive Board of International Chapter. A correction was made on Rule #8 and the corrected rule will be printed in the proceedings.

Patty Fry, secretary, moved the adoption of the distributed convention program with necessary changes. The motion was seconded, and an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 261 votes cast, 131 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 260 pro and 1 con. The motion was adopted.

A quorum being present, the president declared the 118th Convention of Colorado State Chapter opened in due form and ready for the transaction of business.

The members of the Committee to Approve the Minutes of Convention were introduced and thanked for assisting the secretary with the minutes:

Caren Redkey, Chapter IB/CO and Janet Kingsbury, PSPCSC, Chapter BV/CO.

The president announced that Elizabeth McFarland, FV/TX, PSPTSC, was appointed convention parliamentarian by the President of International Chapter.

By authorization of the executive board, the secretary moved to grant disbandment to Chapter GX, Greeley. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 263 votes cast, 132 votes necessary for adoption by a majority, 260 pro and 3 con. The vote was favorable, and the disbandment was granted, effective June 5, 2021.

By authorization of the executive board, the secretary moved to grant disbandment to Chapter CE, Colorado Springs. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 266 votes cast, 134 votes necessary for adoption by a majority, 263 pro and 3 con. The vote was favorable, and the disbandment was granted, effective June 5, 2021.

President Shari Fox recognized organizer Paisley Huntoon, who moved that a charter be granted to Chapter JN, Windsor. There was a second and an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 264 votes cast, 133 votes necessary for adoption by a majority, 264 pro and 0 con. The motion was adopted.

The final Credentials Report was given by chairman Stephanie Oldland, PSP CSC, Chapter BA/CO.

Chairman Stephanie Oldland reported 289 members of convention entitled to vote. Stephanie Oldland moved, and it was seconded that the report be adopted. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 267 votes cast, 134 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 267 pro and 0 con. The report was adopted.

Jan Kulhanek, HX, PSPCSC, Nominating Committee chairman, introduced her committee:

An electronic vote was taken for the entire slate with the following results: 276 votes cast, 139 votes necessary for election by majority, 276 pro and 0 con. The delegates and alternates listed were elected.

In preparation for the presentation of amendments to the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter, the president instructed the convention in the procedure for presentation of amendments and voting. She announced that adopted amendments would take effect at the close of convention and as specified in the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter.

The report of the Amendments and Recommendations (A&R) Committee was given by the chairman, Sandy Renner, PSPCSC, Chapter JH, who first introduced the other members of the committee:

Marcia Williamson, Chapter GG and Leila Calkins, Chapter HK.

A&R Chairman Sandy Renner presented the 2021 proposed amendments to the Bylaws of Colorado_State Chapter. Page numbers refer to the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter as contained in the 2020 Report of the Year.

 Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-3) Amend Article III, Section 2, subsection A by striking out the word "two" and inserting the word "one" and striking out the words "and vice-president", so that if adopted it would read:

A member shall have served in one office of the executive board of state chapter before being elected to the office of president.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 274 votes cast, 183 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 244 pro and 30 con. The amendment was adopted.

The following three amendments were considered as a block.

 Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-4) Amend Article III, Section 5, subsection C., paragraph 1 by striking out the words "one month" and inserting the words "three months" so that if adopted it would read: The appointed past state president shall convene the first meeting of the committee no later than three months following convention of state chapter. A chairman shall be elected at this meeting.

 Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-19) Amend Article XI, Section 1, by striking out subsections C and E.-

NOTE: If this amendment is adopted, the subsequent subsections will be re-lettered to conform.

- 4. Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-21) Amend Article XII, Section 4. by striking out subsection A and inserting a new subsection A so that if adopted it would read:
 - A. To send with the chapter delegate to convention, copies of the local chapter yearbook for display. The number of required yearbooks to be stated on the Yearbook Requirements for Colorado Local Chapters each year.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 278 votes cast, 186 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 267 pro and 11 con. The amendments were adopted.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 278 votes cast, 186 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 262 pro and 16 con. The amendment was adopted.

 Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-9) Amend Article VI, Section 1, by striking out the words "membership dues" so that if adopted it would read:

The Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation is a non-profit corporation under the auspices of Colorado State Chapter. The primary, but not sole, object and purpose of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be to receive contributions, gifts and bequests for the philanthropic, benevolent, charitable and non-profit benefit of members

of Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, and non-members.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 276 votes cast, 185 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 260 pro and 16 con. The amendment was adopted.

- 7. Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-12) Amend ARTICLE VII, Section 5., subsection A, by striking out the word "seven" and inserting the word "eight" and by striking out the words, "and one the western area" and inserting the words, ", one the southwestern area and one the northwestern area" of the state, so that if adopted it would read:
 - A. Appointment. The Membership Committee shall consist of eight members. Three shall represent the Denver metropolitan area, one the northeastern area, one the southeastern area, one the southwestern area and one the northwestern area of the state. One member shall be a past president of Colorado, who shall serve in an at-large capacity. Each member shall serve for three years. Members shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board according to the committee rotation schedule. One member shall be elected by the committee to serve as chairman each year. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the seven members with respective terms of service.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 276 votes cast, 185 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 273 pro and 3 con. The amendment was adopted.

The following two amendments were considered seriatim.

8. Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-12) Amend ARTICLE VII, by adding a new Section 8, so that if adopted it would read:

Section 8. TECHNOLOGY.

A. Appointment. The Technology Committee shall consist of at least four members, each of whom shall serve four years. The senior member in point of service shall be Chairman. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. If an entirely new committee must be

appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and three members who shall serve one, two, three and four years, respectively. The required team composition and needed expertise of each member shall be established annually by the Technology Committee Chairman, who will provide input to the Executive Board on committee member appointments and the skills required. The president and vice president shall serve as ex-officio members.

B. Duties.

- 1. To provide technical leadership, guidance, support, and maintenance of the CO State Chapter technical infrastructure and events (such as workshops and convention), as directed by the Executive Board.
- 2. To maintain the Colorado State Chapter P.E.O. website as directed by the Executive Board
- 3. To maintain and manage the state chapter convention registration system as directed by the Executive Board and Convention Committee Chairman.
- 4. To support local chapters in their use of technology, including navigating and finding information on the International and Colorado State Chapter websites.

C. Reports

- 1. The Chairman shall provide a report/update to the president of the state chapter quarterly and upon request.
- 2. The Chairman shall send an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.
- Submitted by the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter (page BL-1) Amend ARTICLE I, Section 1, by adding the word "Technology", so that if adopted it would read:

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 276 votes cast, 185 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 275 pro and 1 con. The amendments were adopted.

- 10. Submitted by Chapter C, Colorado Springs (page BL-14) Amend ARTICLE VIII SECTION 1., subsection A, paragraph 2. by inserting the words "with \$2.00 designated for the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation (CPCC)" after the words "Colorado State Chapter dues", so that if adopted it would read:-
 - 2. Fourteen dollars (\$14.00) for Colorado State Chapter dues, with \$2.00 designated for the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation (CPCC).

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 276 votes cast, 185 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 181 pro and 95 con. The amendment was defeated.

11. Submitted by the Finance Committee, Colorado State Chapter (page BL-15) Amend Article VIII, Section 3, subsection A, paragraph 2 by inserting the words "treasurer and secretary" after "organizer", so that if adopted it would read:

The cost of travel, housing, and meals to Convention of International Chapter for the organizer, treasurer and secretary of Colorado State Chapter, as a visitor.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 273 votes cast, 183 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 189 pro and 84 con. The amendment was adopted.

At the direction of the A&R Committee, the A&R chairman moved the adoption of the following editorial resolution:

Resolved, That the 2021-2022 Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter be authorized to correct article and section designations, punctuation, and cross-references and to make such other technical and conforming changes as may be necessary to reflect the intent of Colorado State Chapter.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 273 votes cast, 137 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 270 pro and 3 con. The editorial resolution was adopted.

A&R Chairman Sandy Renner presented the proposed resolution submitted by Chapter DJ, Denver.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, P.E.O. is proud of its "Women Educating Women" projects;

WHEREAS, There are women who have a clear career direction based on their chosen degree and should be supported in their drive to achieve a specific educational goal;

WHEREAS, There are a great many women who have attained sophomore completion status in a bachelor's program at institutions of higher learning and are academically successful but challenged to finance an upcoming term:

WHEREAS, These students may be holding down jobs but find it necessary to drop out until they have the necessary funds to continue;

WHEREAS, These students do not currently qualify for a P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education grant and would face a hardship to incur additional debt through the P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund or other lending institution; and

WHEREAS, There is a void to assist students in these circumstances in the existing philanthropic projects offered by the P.E.O. Sisterhood;

RESOLVED, That the Executive Board of International Chapter appoint a special committee to determine the feasibility of establishing a program of grants-in-aid for educational expenses to allow women successfully completing the sophomore term in a bachelor's degree program to continue their education without interruption caused by lack of finances; and that the committee report its findings and recommendations at the 2023 Convention of International Chapter

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 275 votes cast, 184 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 252 pro and 23 con. The vote was favorable and will be considered at the 2021 Convention of International Chapter.

The president thanked the members of the committee for their work.

President Shari Fox called attention to the copy of the budget provided each member of convention in their delegate packet. She introduced the Finance Committee chairman, Diane Ritzdorf, PSPCSC, Chapter FF, who introduced other members of her committee:

Joanne Graham, HU and Catherine Balan, II

The chairman moved the adoption of the report. The vote was divided into three parts:

(1) Adoption of the budget.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 273 votes cast, 137 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 269 pro and 4 con. The budget was adopted.

- (2) Transfer of funds Transfer of \$10,000.00 from the General Fund Surplus to the Colorado State Scholarship Fund; Transfer of \$10,000 from the General Fund surplus to the Cottey Innovations Fund. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 271 votes cast, 136 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 264 pro and 7 con. The transfer of funds was adopted.
- (3) The remainder of the report.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 269 votes cast, 135 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 267 pro and 2 con. The remainder of the report was adopted.

The president stated that the adoption of the report approved the report of the treasurer.

The president thanked the members of the Finance Committee for their careful attention to the financial details of Colorado State Chapter this past year. She announced the audit reports for fiscal years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 are available on the Colorado State Chapter website.

There was no unfinished business requiring a vote of convention.

The president thanked Chairman of Teller Emilie Fox, AT/CO, Timer Ashleigh Snoozy, BI/WY, the Registration Committee and the Credentials Committee, Convention Co-chairs Ann Shepard and Mary Kay Tomlinson, and the Ad-Hoc Tech Committee members: Ann Holmes, Beverly DeVore-Wedding and Clarissa Trapp for their assistance throughout the opening meeting.

President Shari Fox adjourned the first meeting of the 118th Annual Convention of the Colorado State Chapter at 9:07 AM and announced the second meeting would start at 8:00 AM on Sunday, June 6th.

SECOND MEETING Sunday Morning, June 6, 2021

President Shari Fox called the second meeting of the 118th Convention of Colorado State Chapter to order at 8:00 a.m.

Pre-recorded versions of the Pledge of Allegiance, "O Canada" and the "Star Spangled Banner" were played.

Pre-recorded version of the Opening Ode using the Lindly arrangement, followed by the recorded reciting of the Objects and Aims were played.

President Shari Fox welcomed all attendees to the second meeting of convention.

Devotions were presented by Kathy Pirie, Chapter JH.

President Shari Fox introduced and welcomed Representative of International Chapter Elizabeth McFarland, who also served as Parliamentarian during convention. Meetings and Trainings: This officer was trained by her predecessor, the President, and some of the Past State Presidents in the duties of Organizer and trained her successor in the duties of Treasurer. This officer was disappointed to not be able to conduct a question-and-answer session with the International Representative given the limitations of a virtual format. This officer was honored to present a Charter to Chapter JN.

Social Events: Nearly all the social events within the Colorado State Chapter were cancelled due to COVID-19 in-person gathering protocols. However, this officer was able to attend many virtual ZOOM gatherings with local chapters and was greatly appreciative of these opportunities.

Official Visits: This officer developed a PowerPoint presentation for use by the Executive Board and the Past State Presidents when conducting their virtual Official Visits, as required by International this year. This officer conducted fifteen virtual Official Visits in the fall. She expresses a debt of gratitude to the Executive Board and the Past State Presidents who were willing to step out of their "comfort zones" to lead these meetings virtually. Additionally, she thanks the local chapters she visited for their willingness to try

something new for the benefit of our Sisterhood. This officer planned the Official Visits for the fall of 2021.

Annual Report of the Treasurer 2020-2021

This officer performed all the duties and responsibilities of the office as specified in the *Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules of the P.E.O. Sisterhood*, the *Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter* and as directed by the President of Colorado State Chapter.

Meetings and Trainings: This officer was trained by her predecessor in the duties of this office. This officer worked with our new assistant treasurer and assisted with training for that position. This officer attended all meetings of the Colorado State Executive Board and the state Finance Committee. She was disappointed that she was unable to participate in Officer Training Workshops and Official Visits due to the pandemic.

Officer Responsibilities: This officer deposited all funds and paid all expenses as directed by the Executive Board, distributed monthly donations to International and State philanthropies, served as Treasurer for Active Members of Disbanded Chapters, collected Local Chapter dues, prepared the Annual Report of the Treasurer of Colorado State Chapter, audited Local Chapter IRS reports, and assisted in the audit of CSC. This officer also participated in the Executive Board's Tech Training seminars for local chapter Presidents and Technology representatives. She also conducted two "Officer Chats" with registered sisters in February where she answered questions and provided information. She held "Office Hours" for local chapter Treasurers who needed assistance completing their annual reports and worked with the annual reports assistant and the Secretary to verify and complete these required International documents.

Annual Report of the Finance Committee 2020-2021

In accordance with the duties defined in the P.E.O. Constitution and the *Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter*, the Finance Committee submits the following report:

It has been an unusual year for two reasons: Covid 19 pandemic restrictions and the death of our long-time Executive Assistant. The result of both situations is that the Finance Committee has functioned differently.

Janelle Mendelson was hired as Colorado State Chapter's Executive Assistant. The contract for this position has been revised to comply with the State of Colorado's independent contractor requirements. Janelle has been trained by International and has worked diligently to prepare reports for the Executive Board and the Finance Committee.

Reports of state officers containing accounts and expenditures of state chapter funds have been examined and found to be in good order.

The General Fund Budget for the current P.E.O. year 2021-2022, retroactive to April 1, 2021, has been prepared after careful study of the receipts and expenditures for the past year, and submitted for adoption. A copy of the proposed budget will be available to all local chapters via the website.

At its April meeting, the Finance Committee recommended that the majority of the General Fund surplus of \$23,52.52 be transferred as follows: 1) \$10,000 to the Colorado State Scholarship Fund, and 2) \$10,000 to the Cottey Innovations Fund.

The Finance Committee recommends that the allocation of dues for April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022 be as follows:

- \$ 26.00 International Chapter dues, which includes \$6.00 for Cottey College
- \$ 5.00 for expenses of Colorado State Chapter
- \$ 6.50 for expenses of Convention of Colorado State Chapter
- \$ 2.50 for expenses of Convention of International Chapter
- \$ 40.00 Total Dues/Member

Given the change in the IRS mileage rate, the 2021-2022 mileage reimbursement will be \$.56 per mile, effective at the close of this convention and remaining in effect until the opening of convention in 2022.

At the request of the Finance Committee, an amendment will be proposed to allow all State officers to attend the International Conventions every other year.

Annual Report of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation 2020-2021

At the end of June 2021, the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, a non-profit Colorado corporation with 501(c)(3) status granted by the IRS, that is separate and distinct from the Colorado State Chapter of P.E.O. and of which every active Colorado P.E.O. is a member, will have completed its 72nd trip around the sun. And oh my – what a trip it has been.

Recommitting to the guiding principles discussed and agreed to at a February 2020 board retreat, the CPCC board began this board year last June determined to continue the 2019-2020 board's goal to establish its place firmly in the "solution" column of the problem-vs.-solution assessment of CPCC boards. The tasks we identified to work toward this goal included:

- compliance with our corporation's governing documents,
- full disclosure of facts whether good, bad, or ugly,
- transparency in operations and communications,
- monthly financials made available to our membership,
- critically and thoroughly assessing the safety of our then 54-year-old Chapter House building after years of deferred maintenance,
- in view of its consistent annual operating loss of \$100,000 per year since FY 2017, critically and thoroughly assessing the viability of continued Chapter House residence operations under its current business model, and bringing viable options to our membership at this 2021 annual meeting for the future of the Chapter House project.

We could not have imagined the sequence of adventures that execution of those tasks, and Covid-19, would unleash.

Too many to detail in an annual report – please look back at our Charitable Corporation Connections newsletters this past year for details.

But here are a few trigger words to help conjure up memories of some of those adventures:

fire safety inspection, egress obstruction, untempered glass, landlord/tenant, wildfire mitigation, pine needles, mold, pests, water damage, sill plates; a new permanent house manager who turned out to be temporary and a temporary house manager who turned out to be a source of consistency and reliability throughout this year of unexpected twists and turns; sump pump, cesspit; hailstorm, roof leaks, lockdown, quarantine, unrelated business income; special meeting, "property" vs. "project"; asbestos abatement, demolition, fire department training drills, local chapter Zoom meetings, boilers, water heaters, remodels, backflow preventers, gas line mapping; Chapter House Review Committee Report, broker's price opinion, evolve, business model, forecast; Christmas light tour, movie nights, Bambi window; CCC, CNA, Q/A, UBIT, TBD, ADA, PPRBD and CTSD (continuing traumatic stress disorder = a condition often brought on by one unexpected adventure after another for a somewhat extended length of time, sometimes resulting in numbed reactions to further adventures and occasional glazed-over appearance, best survived with sisters in purpose, humor and stubbornness).

We also learned a few hard lessons this year, including that passion is not enough to sustain a philanthropic project, but that action <u>must</u> accompany it.

And you all, our CPCC membership, jumped on to ride and learn about it all along with us – the good, the bad, the ugly, and the hard lessons. Thank you. For your

questions, your engagement, and your willingness to learn. Your engagement has fueled us, and we are sincerely grateful.

It is your engagement and your action that will help the CPCC navigate the changes that must happen, no matter what form they may take, to ensure that all projects of the CPCC can continue to serve the residents of Colorado for many years to come.

Only with a formidable team could the goals and tasks of this past year have been even visualized, let alone attempted. It has been my privilege and honor to serve alongside and learn at the hands of these remarkable women: Susan Miller, L J Van Belkum, Jill Hyde, Liz Aikin, along with her co-Chapter House trustees Kathy Bath and Martha Kuhn, Janet Kingbury, along with her co-Marguerite Fund trustees Barbara Pingrey and Barb Hunter, Shari Fox, President, CSC and Kendy Cusick-Rindone, VP, CSC

Thank you doesn't feel adequate for the work they do, the thought they inject in every discussion and decision, the endurance they have demonstrated, and the grace under pressure they have modeled effortlessly. Thank you anyway. Their courage to make changes, when "that's the way we've always done it" is no longer working, will enable this philanthropy to not only survive, but to thrive.

The Marguerite Fund trustees include me, chairman; Barb Hunter, vice-chair; Barbara Pingrey, secretary and Shari Fox, Colorado State Chapter President, Adviser.

The trustees held two official meetings this year, one in July and one in January. During these meetings applications were reviewed and official business discussed. Due to Covid we found Zoom meetings to be beneficial. Our Zoom meetings allowed additional meetings to review applications. We had a Christmas Zoom in which we shared a favorite coffee cup and some history to go with it. That was a lot of fun! Annual Report for Chapter House Trustees 2020-2021

The Chapter House Trustees have had a busy and unusual year. Due to the COVID situation, all outside activities at CH have continued to be canceled.

In June, Bill Tremmel, who has non-profit experience and facilities management skills including remodel/maintenance work as well as other relevant experience, was hired as Interim House Manager. When the new House Manager hired in August did not work out as expected, Bill became House Manager in October with Tanya Adams designated as Assistant House Manager in December. Bill's list of qualifications has proved to be invaluable to the running of Chapter House and working with residents, staff, and Board members of CPCC (Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation). His expertise in maintenance, repair, and replacement of Chapter House needs has been impressive.

COVID requirements set by CDC and the state continue to be observed and updated, as necessary. Fire mitigation needs on the grounds were explored with the Fire Department plus a Fire/Life Safety Re-inspection inside the Chapter House conducted. Corrections as needed have been addressed. A hailstorm in early August caused quite a bit of damage and added to the debris clean-up project that was already in process on the grounds. Manuals pertaining to residents' occupancy, employees' work, and other forms were reviewed, updated, and distributed. Share the Care guidelines were also updated and given to residents who need that assistance.

The monthly CCC (Charitable Corporation Connections) newsletters from CPCC sent to all Colorado members whose e-mail addresses are known have listed the many repairs and maintenance needs at Chapter House. The expense to fix these many issues has been considerable but necessary for the safety of the Chapter House and its residents. The Chapter House Review Committee Final Report was completed November 30, 2020, after an in-depth analysis of all aspects of Chapter House by the group appointed in January 2020. The report has been made available to all Colorado P.E.O.s on the state's website.

Between January and April 2021, the Board of Directors of CPCC conducted twice weekly Zoom meetings available to all Colorado chapters to share facts and answer any questions that chapters have about the workings of CPCC and Chapter House.

The Chapter House trustees have enjoyed working with the CPCC board, the CH staff, and most of all, the residents of Chapter House.

Annual Report of Colorado State Scholarship Fund Committee 2020-2021

Knit together in sisterly love. It is certainly the best theme we could have had for this COVID-19 year, as we all were told to stay at home. As with all knitting projects you first start with making a swatch to get the right gauge for the project. We found that we had to change our needles twice before we had the right gauge and could begin working on the project.

Our committee started with 3 ladies and our state officer adviser and we ended with a wonderful different group. We were deeply sorry that Eileen Field had to resign for personal reasons but are incredibly grateful for Abby Rule who joined the committee. After we received all the papers from the previous committee, and it was finally determined who was the chairman of the committee, work began. Time was spent updating and making a notebook with both information and history of this committee for each member to have. Half of our applications were received my mail, so they had to be scanned, the others were received as PDFs through email. All applications were sent via email to committee members to review before we got together to pick the recipients.

We first want to thank all Colorado Chapters for their generous donations to the Colorado State Scholarship Fund which this year over \$83,000. We had 41 applications and are giving 35 scholarships with many of the girls pursing non-traditional education in Cosmetology, EMT, Graphic Design, Auto Tech, Agriculture, Physical Therapy, and even Equine Studies. We gave eight \$5,000, eight \$2,500, nine \$1,500, nine \$1,000, and one \$500 scholarship.

Our committee has continued this year to make every effort to limit expenses. Most communications were done through email, and phone. But with Zoom we had 3 wonderful meetings, first time to just met each other and talk about job on the committee; second, we spent several hours going through all the applications and selecting our recipients for this year; third meeting, we spent time going over and updating the application and brochure along with our policy manual and working calendar.

Each member of the committee has seen this time as a privilege to serve on the Colorado State Scholarship Fund Committee. It is such an honor to be able to help deserving young women see that their dreams can come true and that there are women who really do believe in them. We get to know all of them on paper.

I am grateful for the members who made up the 2019-2020 Cottey Committee: Vice Chair Nancy Eakins and Secretary Martha Shuss, both who are Cottey alumna. Though we were not able to meet in person, we were able meet via Zoom and meet goals. A Special Thank you to State Chapter Treasurer Cori Tanner for being an encourager and supportive adviser. ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ELF COMMITTEE 2020-2021

Annual Report of the IPS Committee 2020-2021

P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund (IPS) was established in 1949 to provide scholarships for international women students to pursue graduate study in the United States and Canada.

To date, \$45,218,163 has been awarded!

In 2020-2021, there are 212 IPS recipients from 74 different countries who were awarded \$2,211,000. They will be studying at 108 different colleges and universities in 33 states and seven Canadian provinces. In consideration of the COVID-19 Pandemic, IPS students have been allowed a one-year exemption from the requirement to attend classes in person, as many institutions are offering online classes only. (Students must still be present physically in the U.S./Canada.)

Colorado is fortunate to have an extraordinary IPS recipient, **Rachel Kamnkhwani**, from Malawi. She is pursuing an EDD in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies, at the University of Denver. Rachel will be our pre-recorded speaker during this 2020-2021 Colorado State Convention.

Colorado members of P.E.O. believe that education is fundamental to world peace and understanding, and 44 chapters have made a minimum donation of \$500, to join in the mission to Foster Peace through Education by becoming **Partners In Peace**. "The PCE grant program was established in 1973 as a need-based grant program providing on-time financial assistance to women whose education has been interrupted and who find it necessary to return to school to complete a degree or certification. The skill or certification obtained is intended to improve their marketable skills for employment to support themselves and/or their families."

Colorado chapters successfully sponsored a total of 54 PCE grant recipients from March 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021 totaling \$93,800.00. This is a decrease from the previous year but considering what the whole world has experienced in 2020 this is understandable. The range of recipient monies given was \$500-\$3000, the average being \$1737.00. Seven women received the maximum amount of \$3,000.

Annual Report of the Membership Committee 2020-2021

Annual Report of the History Committee 2020-2021

Each year, the two-person History Committee preserves the activities of the Colorado State Chapter, 50+ year members, newly formed chapters, and chapters celebrating 25-, 50-, 75-, and 100-year anniversaries. This history is collected from anniversary chapters, the P.E.O. Record, and even social media. As a reminder, the history year runs from June 1 to May 31 to coincide celebration of anniversaries during a calendar with Convention of Colorado State Chapter.

Dyanna Haley-Rezac, EA, Colorado Springs, joined the committee for the 2020-2021 year with

Kristina Walker from Wiley who was the chair for this year. Due to the COVID pandemic, the history committee was not able to meet until the end of February and plans to start the digital scrapbook had not been followed through on. Dyanna and Kris met with Clarissa Trapp and Patty Fry in February and March to discuss the committee's goals and to exchange the last large scrapbook, scrapbooking supplies, and some committee files. During this meeting, we reviewed the instruction books for the history committee and found several differences between them as well as corrections that need to be made. These will be updated and approved by the incoming state secretary prior to transitioning the new history committee member in.

Discussion also included how to organize the scrapbooks going forward digitally and it was determined the history committee would do one Shutterfly book per year to print for state convention, for the state officers during that year and any others who wished to purchase a book with the order from at state convention. These books will be combined approximately every 5 years into a larger volume and available for purchase to the Colorado P.E.O. membership. Additionally, the previous large

scrapbooks have been photographed up to 2016 and these will be created into a Colorado history Shutterfly album. 2016-2019 will also be photographed and included. The history process of converting our large books to a 12"x12" Shutterfly album is more time consuming and tedious and may take several years; however, the books from 2020 on will be done in real time as events happen. Due to the lack of events and photos in 2020, the first digital book will cover 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. All the photos taken of previous books are now uploaded in the committee shared Shutterfly account by folder for years that pertain. As these are photos of pages, they need to be edited and reformatted. It was agreed that other sisters could assist the committee without being on the committee to help with this large task. The history committee is looking for willing collaborators with the understanding that they are not official committee members, nor will they receive reimbursement for expenses from P.E.O. for convention or meetings.

The current, first edition, of all digital scrapbook is underway in Shutterfly and pages are being created as events happen. Colorado State P.E.O. created a private Facebook group this year which the history committee is utilizing to collect photos and details of events from chapters in addition to the monthly newsletters and Record. We also still maintain the dedicated gmail.com account to gather information from sisters.

It had been planned at Convention of State Chapter in June 2020 for Lois Abbuhl, M, to design a photobooks creation and history preservation training workshop to fill the need of sisters who were interested in learning more about how to preserve their chapter's history. As that convention was cancelled and the June 2021 one was virtual, Dyanna Haley-Rezac did a video tutorial recorded program on how to do this which was available to sisters at convention and is now on the Colorado P.E.O. website. The history committee is planning a live workshop for June 2022.

This past year has been chock full of challenges with COVID, but with challenge, comes change. Since meeting this year, the process for digitizing scrapbooks is well underway and the addition of a state chapter Facebook group is already proving to be invaluable in gathering photos and events in real time. The major limitation is that there are only 248 sisters on this private group which we would like to see increase substantially for a better representation of our state sisterhood.

Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter P.E.O. Sisterhood

(As amended June 5, 2021)

ARTICLE I - CONVENTION

Section 1. MEMBERS. The Convention of Colorado State Chapter shall consist of the following active members, when present and registered:

The Executive Board

Past Presidents of Colorado State Chapter Resident

Past Presidents of International Chapter

One delegate from each local chapter, the president being a delegate when feasible

Chairman of the EB Nominating Committee

Board of Directors of CO P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Trustees

of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House

Trustees of Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund

Members of the following Standing Committees:

Amendments and Recommendations

Colorado State Scholarship

Finance

History

International Projects

Membership

State Unaffiliate Chair

Technology

Section 2. TIME AND PLACE. The convention shall convene annually in the month of June at a place approved by the executive board.

Section 3. HOSTESS CHAPTERS.

A. The convention shall be arranged by groups of local chapters, assigned geographically by a special committee composed of three past presidents appointed by the chairman of the Past Presidents' Group. A projected five- year schedule of hostess chapters shall be reported each year at convention and printed in the proceedings of convention.

B. The hostess chapters, when notified by the vice president of state chapter, shall meet to organize and formulate plans for the convention of state chapter at which she will preside.

Section 4. REPORTS. Within one month following convention, delegates shall make a report of convention business to their respective chapters.

Section 5. FORMAL ACTION. Any item passed by Convention of Colorado State Chapter that must be implemented by local chapters shall become effective at the close of convention, unless otherwise ordered, and shall be implemented by local chapters upon receipt of the Proceedings of

convention of Colorado State Chapter. Annual printing of the Bylaws and Standing Rules shall have all changes printed in bold type.

ARTICLE II – CONVENTION OF INTERNATIONAL CHAPTER

Section 1. DELEGATES. Delegates from Colorado State Chapter to the Convention of International Chapter shall be chosen in rotation from groups of seven local chapters or major fraction thereof. These groups shall be designated geographically by the executive board and the schedule shall be printed annually in the proceedings of the convention of state chapter.

Section 2. NOMINATION AND ELECTION.

- A. In the year of Convention of International Chapter, local chapters entitled to representation shall nominate a delegate and an alternate at the time of annual election.
- B. Names of the nominees for delegates and alternates shall be submitted as required by International Chapter. The nominees shall be submitted to the following convention of state chapter for election.

Section 3. PAST PRESIDENTS. Designation of the past presidents of the state chapter, and their alternates, entitled to housing and meals at the Convention of International Chapter shall be determined by the Past

Presidents' Group. The immediate past president shall be one of those designated, when feasible.

Section 4. VACANCY IN DELEGATION.

- A. A vacancy in the delegation shall be filled by the president of the state chapter who shall appoint in the following order:
 - 1. The alternate;
 - 2. A member of the chapter entitled to representation;
 - 3. A member of another chapter in the group;
 - 4. A member of the state chapter at large.

A chapter failing to have representation according to the established schedule is ineligible to nominate a delegate until the next rotational assignment.

B. A vacancy in the representation of past presidents entitled to housing and meals shall be filled by the president of state chapter by the appointment of an alternate designated by the Past Presidents' Group.

Section 5. REPORTS.

A. Each delegate shall prepare a report of the business and other highlights of the convention. The report shall be given in person to the chapters assigned by the president of state chapter within six weeks after the close of convention.

- B. Past state presidents and state officers who attend Convention of International Chapter may be called upon to make reports when needed.
- C. The president of state chapter shall be notified in writing when all reports have been completed.

ARTICLE III - NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- **Section 1. METHOD OF NOMINATION.** Nomination of officers of Colorado State Chapter shall be by a nominating committee. The committee shall receive proposed names as follows:
 - A. An officer presently serving on the executive board shall send written consent to be a nominee for the next office in sequence t to the chairman of the Nominating Committee by March 1.
 - B. The executive board, board of directors, trustees, standing committees, and local chapters may propose names by submitting an application with letters of recommendation to the chairman of the Nominating Committee by February 15.

Section 2. ELIGIBILITY.

- A. A member shall have served in **one** office of the executive board of state chapter before being elected to the office of president.
- B. In order to be eligible for any other office on the executive board of state chapter, a member shall:
 - 1. Be an active member of the P.E.O. Sisterhood for at least five years and shall have served one year as president of a Colorado chapter.
 - 2. Be a member of a chapter not represented currently on the executive board.
 - 3. Be a member of the convention at which her name is presented.
 - 4. Be present at the time of election, if not a member of the executive board.
- **Section 3. SEQUENCE OF OFFICERS.** The sequence of officers for the executive board shall be president, vice president, organizer, treasurer and secretary.
- **Section 4. TENURE.** An officer shall serve one term only in each office. A second term in the same office must have the unanimous approval of the executive board.

Section 5. NOMINATING COMMITTEE.

A. Membership. The committee shall consist of past state president, and four active resident members. Committee members shall serve from the time the committee is announced at convention of state chapter to the

following May 1, with the exception of the chairman, who shall serve until the close of convention. A new committee shall serve annually.

- B. Procedure for Membership.
 - 1. The past state president shall be appointed by the president with the approval of the executive board. The executive board shall assign local chapters to a Nominating Committee District Rotation Schedule which shall be printed annually in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.
 - 2. The chapters designated in the schedule shall elect a member to serve on the Nominating Committee the first business meeting in March.
 - 3. The designated chapter presidents shall send the name, address, telephone number with area code, and email address of the elected member to the vice president by April 1.

C. Duties.

- 1. The appointed past state president shall convene the first meeting of the committee no later than **three months** following convention of state chapter. A chairman shall be elected at this meeting.
- 2. The committee shall review and select the nominee based on the data received.
- 3. At least two committee members shall interview each qualified candidate.
- 4. The chairman shall notify the executive board of the selected nominee and post the name and qualifications of the nominee on the Colorado State Chapter website by May 1, prior to convention of state chapter.
- 5. The chairman shall notify a chapter represented on the Nominating Committee to elect another member if a vacancy on the committee occurs from the chapter.
- 6. The chairman shall be the only member of the committee to be a member of convention of state chapter by virtue of this committee designation.
- 7. The chairman shall submit an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. The report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 6. NOMINATION OF OFFICERS. At convention of state chapter, the chairman of the Nominating Committee shall present one nominee for each office. At the time of election, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor for each office. Consent of all nominees must be obtained.

Section 7. ELECTION OF OFFICERS. Election of officers shall be by written ballot. When nomination of officers has been by a committee, and there is but one nominee for each office and no further nominations from the floor for each office called for in sequence, by general consent the ballot may be dispensed with and the vote for the ticket taken by voice. If there are

BL - 4 2021 CO State Chapter Bylaws and Standing Rules nominations from the floor for any office, separate elective ballots for such office shall be taken. A majority of votes cast shall elect.

Section 8. VACANCY. If a vacancy occurs from a resignation, such resignation shall be in writing to the executive board. The executive board shall declare the office vacant only if an officer fails or is unable to respond in writing within two weeks to a written request for clarification of her intent. The

written request shall be sent to the member's address as listed on the International Chapter Membership Portal.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF STATE OFFICERS

The following duties are in addition to those listed in the Constitution, Part II, Article VIII, and the Instructions to Officers of State, Provincial and District Chapters.

Section 1. PRESIDENT. The duties of president shall be:

- A. To assign duties to the officers of Colorado State Chapter as advisers to all International and state philanthropies, state committees, except for the Nominating Committee, and other duties deemed appropriate as outlined in the Executive Board Policy Manual.
- B. To provide for equitable representation of chapters by appointing no more than one member per chapter, (with exception of past state president chapters), to serve as a trustee or member of a standing committee, nor shall such member serve in more than one position concurrently as a director, trustee or member of a standing committee.
- C. To appoint, at the beginning of her term of office, trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund, standing committees, special committees, and a past state president to the Nominating Committee, with the approval of the executive board or by authorization of a convention of state chapter.
- D. To fill an interim vacancy occurring on the trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund, standing committees and/or special committees with the approval of the executive board.
- E. To announce, at the beginning of her term of office, the members of the Nominating Committee.
- F. To appoint annually at the beginning of her term of office, with the approval of the executive board, a Nominating Committee for the Colorado
- P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, consisting of a past state president of Colorado State Chapter who will serve as chairman, and two active resident members of Colorado State Chapter.

- G. To fill an interim vacancy on the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors Nominating Committee.
- H. To designate the time and place for the annual meeting of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, in conjunction with the convention of state chapter.
- I. To serve as an ex-officio member of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, trustees of the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund, standing and special committees, except the Nominating Committee for the executive board and the Nominating Committee of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.
- J. To assist the next state convention chairman and the chairman of the Finance Committee in preparation of a budget for the convention atwhich she will preside.
- K. To direct the review and signing of the Executive Assistant Agreement(s).
- L. To provide the executive assistant(s) with the Executive Assistant Policy Manual and direct review of the same annually.
- M. To retain for four years all written communications received annually from executive assistant(s).
- N. To conduct Local Chapter Officers' Workshops for chapters as assigned.
- O. To serve as a proxy organizer.
- P. As final duty as outgoing president, to ensure the compilation and distribution of proceedings of convention containing current bylaws and standing rules within three months of completing her term of office.

Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT. The duties of the vice president shall be:

- A. To perform duties as assigned by the president of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. To serve as state adviser to the State Unaffiliate Chairman.
- C. To serve as an ex-officio member, without vote, of the Finance Committee.
- D. To serve as an ex-officio member of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, having a vote in the absence of the president of Colorado State Chapter.
- E. To serve as state chairman of Colorado Cottey College Scholarship Fund and adviser for the state Cottey College subcommittee.

- F. To supervise Reciprocity Groups and P.E.O. Groups.
- G. To serve as a proxy organizer.
- H. To conduct Local Chapter Officers' Workshops for chapters as assigned.
- I. To notify the presidents of designated chapters on the Nominating Committee District Rotation Schedule to elect a member to the Nominating Committee.
- J. To provide the executive assistant(s) with necessary information as directed in the Executive Assistant Policy Manual.
- K. To notify each hostess chapter in January, one year preceding the convention, to elect two representatives to serve on the convention committee.
- L. To select members of a convention site selection committee, if needed, who will be appointed at the next state convention.
- M. To notify by February 1, in the year of Convention of International Chapter, those chapters entitled to representation.

Section 3. ORGANIZER. The duties of organizer shall be:

- A. To perform duties as assigned by the president of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. To group local chapters geographically for the official visits.
- C. To officially visit chapters and direct appointed proxies.
- D. To visit or direct a proxy to visit a new chapter during the yearfollowing organization and the second and/or third year as deemed necessary.
- E. To conduct Local Chapter Officers' Workshops and to appoint proxies to assist.
- F. To provide the executive assistant(s) with necessary information as directed in the Executive Assistant Policy Manual.
- G. To serve as adviser to the Membership Committee.
- H. To oversee the review of local chapter yearbooks for compliance with requirements.

Section 4. TREASURER. The duties of treasurer shall be:

- A. To perform duties as assigned by the president of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. To serve as ex-officio member, without vote, of the Finance Committee and provide financial information to said committee when requested.
- C. To serve as a proxy organizer.

- D. To conduct Local Chapter Officers' Workshops for chapters as assigned.
- E. To provide for the safe keeping of the financial documents of the state chapter.
- F. To submit, at the end of each fiscal year, the financial accounts of the state chapter to a qualified CPA firm appointed by the executive board.
- G. To provide the executive assistant(s) with necessary information as directed in the Executive Assistant Policy Manual.

Section 5. SECRETARY. The duties of secretary shall be:

- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{A}}.$ To perform duties as assigned by the president of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. To serve as a proxy organizer when necessary.
- C. To conduct Local Chapter Officers' Workshops for chapters as assigned.
- D. To distribute the Colorado State Chapter newsletter and other state chapter correspondence as directed by the president.
- E. To assist with publication on the Colorado State Chapter website, a copy of the current amended bylaws and standing rules of Colorado State Chapter, with assistance of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee, within a month following convention at which she served as secretary.
- F. To verify the eligibility of each nominee for delegate to Convention of International Chapter.
- G. To provide the executive assistant(s) with necessary information as directed in the Executive Assistant Policy Manual.

ARTICLE V - EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT

The Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter may contract for the services of a qualified executive assistant or assistants. The Agreement shall be reviewed and signed annually. The executive assistant(s) shall be an active Colorado

P.E.O. member and shall provide services as directed in the Executive Assistant Policy Manual, provided and approved by a majority vote of the entire executive board. The amount of compensation for services rendered shall be determined by the executive board in consultation with the state Finance Committee and included in the annual budget of the General Fund. Conditions for termination shall be specified in the Agreement.

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2021 CO State Chapter Bylaws and Standing Rules

ARTICLE VI - CO P.E.O. CHARITABLE CORPORATION

Section 1. PURPOSE. The Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation is a non- profit corporation under the auspices of Colorado State Chapter. The primary, but not sole, object and purpose of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be to receive contributions, gifts and bequests for the philanthropic, benevolent, charitable and non-profit benefit of members of Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, and non-members.

Section 2. MEMBERS. All active members of the Colorado State Chapter are members of the corporation and are subject to the regulations of the state chapter and the International Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood.

Section 3. ADMINISTRATION. Administration of the corporation shall be by a board of directors as provided in the Articles of Incorporation and the bylaws of the corporation.

Section 4. CORPORATE MEETINGS. Notice of the time and place of the annual meeting of the corporation shall be sent to local chapters as provided in the bylaws of the corporation.

Section 5. PROJECTS. The two primary Colorado State P.E.O. projects that are operated and maintained under the authority of the board of directors of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation are the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House and the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund, as provided in the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 6. FINANCE.

A. Voluntary Contributions. Voluntary contributions for the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House and the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund shall be sent to Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation and shall be designated for the appropriate project.

- B. Expenses. All expenses incurred by Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be paid from Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation funds.
- C. Annual Audit. A copy of the annual audit of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be sent to the president of state chapter.

Section 7. ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND BYLAWS.

A. The Bylaws of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be consistent with the Articles of Incorporation, laws of the Sisterhood and the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter.

B. The Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be published annually on the Colorado State Chapter website.

ARTICLE VII - STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. AMENDMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

A. Appointment. The Amendments and Recommendations Committee shall consist of three members, one of whom shall be a past president of state chapter. Each member shall serve for three years. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. The senior member in point of service shall be chairman. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and the second and third member who shall serve one, two and three years, respectively.

B. Duties.

- 1. To review and consider proposed amendments, resolutions and/or recommendations submitted by the executive board, board of directors, trustees, standing committees, and local chapters for conformity to the P.E.O. Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter.
- 2. To prepare, in parliamentary form, proposed amendments, resolutions and/or recommendations submitted to the committee for presentation at convention of state chapter.
- 3. To send a copy of the proposed amendments, resolutions and/or recommendations by May 1 to the following:
 - a. Members of the executive board
 - b. Members of board of directors, trustees and standing committees
 - c. Past presidents of Colorado State Chapter
 - d. Each local chapter
 - e. Chairman of the Nominating Committee
- 4. To present all amendments, resolutions and/or recommendations to the convention of state chapter for approval.
- C. Reports. The chairman shall send an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 2. FINANCE.

A. Appointment. The Finance Committee shall consist of three members, one of whom shall be a past president of state chapter. Each membershall serve for three years. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. The senior member in point of service shall be the chairman. If an entirely new

committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and the second and third member who shall serve one, two and three years, respectively.

- B. Duties. The following duties are in addition to those listed in the P.E.O. Constitution, Part II, Article IX, Sect. 9:
 - 1. To consult with and advise the executive board on matters of state finance.
 - 2. To prepare and present a general fund budget for the ensuing fiscal year for consideration at the convention of state chapter. A copy of the proposed general fund budget with appropriations shall be posted on the Colorado website by May 1. Upon request, any additional state chapter financial information shall be made available to any active member of Colorado State Chapter.
 - 3. The chairman shall assist the chairman of the convention committee and the state president in preparing a proposed convention budget.
 - 4. To prepare and present a proposed allocation of state dues, when necessary, for consideration at convention of state chapter.
 - 5. To recommend transfer of funds, when necessary.
- C. Reports. The chairman shall send an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 3. HISTORY.

A. Appointment. The History Committee shall consist of two members, each of whom shall serve two years. The senior member in point of service shall be chairman. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and the second member who shall serve one and two years, respectively.

B. Duties.

- 1. To compile and preserve historical data relative to P.E.O. in Colorado.
- 2. To compile and administer a program file for local chapters of topics other than International and state projects.
- C. Reports. The chairman shall send an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 4. INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS.

A. Appointment. The International Projects Committee shall consist of six subcommittees: P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund; Cottey College; P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund; P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education; P.E.O. Scholar Awards and P.E.O. STAR Scholarship. Each

subcommittee shall consist of two members who shall serve for two years, except for the Cottey College subcommittee which shall consist of three members who shall serve for three years. One member shall be appointed annually to each subcommittee by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. The senior member in point of service shall be the chairman. If an entirely new subcommittee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and the other members with respective terms of service.

B. Duties.

- 1. The members of the P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund, P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund, P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education, P.E.O. Scholar Awards and P.E.O. STAR Scholarship subcommittees under the direction of the state adviser shall:
 - a. Promote the project and maintain the necessary records.
 - b. Provide informational and program material to local chapters upon request.
 - c. Prepare project information for newsletter of state chapter, when requested.
 - d. Prepare the project convention displays.
- 2. The members of the Cottey College subcommittee, under the direction of the state adviser and chairman of the state scholarships, shall:
 - a. Promote Cottey College and assist in the selection of Colorado State Chapter Cottey scholarship recipients.
 - b. Provide informational and program material to local chapters.
 - c. Submit articles for newsletter of state chapter when requested.
 - d. Prepare the project convention display.
- C. Reports. Each subcommittee chairman shall submit an annual report to the state chapter adviser by May 1. These reports shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 5. MEMBERSHIP.

A. Appointment. The Membership Committee shall consist of eight members. Three shall represent the Denver metropolitan area, one the northeastern area, one the southeastern area, one the southeastern area, one the southwestern area and one the northwestern area of the state. One member shall be a past president of Colorado, who shall serve in an at-large capacity. Each member shall serve for three years. Members shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board according to the committee rotation schedule. One member shall be elected by the committee toserve as chairman each year. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the seven members with respective terms of service.

B. Duties.

- 1. To educate local chapters about methods of mentoring new members, maintaining membership of non-participating members, preventing and reinstating inactive members.
- 2. To motivate local chapters to increase membership through initiations and transfers.
- 3. To assist local chapters in revitalizing and reinvigoration when appropriate.
- 4. To celebrate and inspire healthy local chapters.
- 5. To maintain confidentiality at all times.
- 6. To prepare and present a membership workshop and display for convention of state chapter when requested.
- C. Meetings. This committee shall meet when necessary with the approval of the state adviser.
- D. Reports. The chairman shall submit an annual report to the state adviser by May
- 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 6. STATE UNAFFILIATE CHAIRMAN.

- A. Appointment. The State Unaffiliate Chairman shall be appointed by the president with approval of the executive board for a term of three years.
- B. Duties.
 - 1. To maintain the state unaffiliate lists divided by district and provide monthly lists to the president for posting on the Colorado website.
 - To provide state unaffiliate lists and Introduction of a Woman not a P.E.O. lists upon request to Colorado reciprocities and active members of Colorado State Chapter.
- C. Reports. The chairman shall submit an annual report to the state adviser by May
- 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 7. COLORADO STATE SCHOLARSHIP.

A. Appointment. The Colorado State Scholarship Committee shall consist of three members. Each member shall serve for three years. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. The senior member in point of service shall be chairman. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and the second and third member who shall serve one, two and three years, respectively.

- B. Duties. The duties of this committee shall be as follows:
 - 1. To receive and process applications and award scholarships from funds available.
 - 2. To provide information and program materials to local chapters.
 - 3. To prepare information for the newsletter of state chapter, upon request.
 - 4. To prepare a convention display, upon request.
- C. Meetings. This committee shall meet when necessary with the approval of the state adviser.
- D. Reports. The chairman shall send an annual report of the activities of the committee to the state adviser by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 8. TECHNOLOGY

A. Appointment. The Technology Committee shall consist of at least four members, each of whom shall serve four years. The senior member in point of service shall be Chairman. One member shall be appointed each year by the president of state chapter with the approval of the executive board. If an entirely new committee must be appointed, the president shall designate the chairman and three members who shall serve one, two, three and four years, respectively. The required team composition and needed expertise of each member shall be established annually by the Technology Committee Chairman, who will provide input to the Executive Board on committee member appointments and the skills required. The president and vice president shall serve as ex-officio members.

B. Duties.

- 1. To provide technical leadership, guidance, support, and maintenance of the CO State Chapter technical infrastructure and events (such as workshops and convention), as directed by the Executive Board.
- 2. To maintain the Colorado State Chapter P.E.O. website as directed by the Executive Board.
- 3. To maintain and manage the state chapter convention registration system as directed by the Executive Board and Convention Committee Chairman.
- 4. To support local chapters in their use of technology, including navigating and finding information on the International and Colorado State Chapter websites.

C. Reports.

- 1. The Chairman shall provide a report/update to the president of the state chapter quarterly and upon request.
- 2. The Chairman shall send an annual report to the president of state chapter by May 1. This report shall be printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

ARTICLE VIII - FINANCE

Section 1. DUES.

- A. The annual dues of Colorado State Chapter shall be fortydollars (\$40.00) per active member and shall be allocated as follows:
 - 1. Twenty-six dollars (\$26.00) for International Chapter dues, which shall include six dollars (\$6.00) for Cottey College.
 - 2. Fourteen dollars (\$14.00) for Colorado State Chapter dues.
- B. The state chapter dues shall be allocated annually as recommended by the Finance Committee with the approval of the executive board and presented to convention of state chapter for approval.
- C. Each local chapter shall pay a fifteen dollar (\$15.00) annual fee for workshops for local chapter officers. This amount shall be sent with the annual dues to the treasurer of the state chapter and shall be placed in the General Fund.

Section 2. CONVENTION OF STATE CHAPTER.

- A. The State Chapter.
 - 1. A convention fund shall be maintained, and disbursements shall be made for the following expenses:
 - a. Housing and meals for local chapter delegates, members of the executive board, past presidents of the state chapter, standing committees, chairman of the Nominating Committee, and the chairman of the following year's convention. Convention committee members and other convention participants shall be included when deemed necessary by the president of state chapter.
 - b. The Memorial Hour, Period of Instruction, Philanthropies Program(s), project and workshop materials, and insurance for convention.

- c. Audio/Visual expenses of convention.
- 2. If the amount of the Convention Fund exceeds the expense of convention, the balance shall be transferred to the General Reserve Fund of the state chapter. If the expenses of the convention exceed the amount in the Convention Fund, the deficit shall be paid from the General Reserve Fund of the state chapter.
- 3. A complete financial report of the Convention Fund for the previous year shall be posted at convention and printed in the proceedings.
- B. Convention Committee.
 - 1. The chairman of the convention committee, with the assistance of the chairman of the Finance Committee, and the state president, shall prepare a proposed budget for convention within three months of the close of the previous convention.
 - 2. A fee shall be charged for late convention registrations. This fee shall be deposited in the Convention Fund of the state chapter.
 - 3. The treasurer of the convention committee shall submit, by September 15 following convention, all financial accounts to the Finance Committee for audit.
- C. Local Chapter. Each chapter shall pay the delegate's travel expenses for convention as well as housing and travel expenses incurred prior to the formal opening and after closing of convention of state chapter. Each chapter shall pay the registration fee, if applicable, to convention of state chapter.

Section 3. CONVENTION OF INTERNATIONAL CHAPTER.

- A. The state chapter shall maintain an International Convention Fund, and disbursements shall be made for the following expenses:
 - 1. The necessary cost of travel to Convention of International Chapter of the president, vice president, local chapter delegates, and past presidents entitled to housing and meals.
 - 2. The cost of travel, housing and meals to Convention of International Chapter for the organizer, **treasurer and secretary** of Colorado State Chapter, as a visitor.
 - 3. A meal allowance consistent with current GSA standards when travel arrangements for the delegation mandate arrival at the convention site more than twelve hours prior to the formal opening of Convention of International Chapter, when substantiated with original receipts or other documentation and submitted within three months of being incurred.
 - 4. The necessary cost of arrangements incurred by the president in leading the delegation.
 - 5. Mileage shall be paid to delegates when presenting a report of convention. The allowance for mileage shall be in accordance with Internal Revenue Service guidelines and the amount determined each

- year. The amount for the ensuing year shall be included in the annual report of the Finance Committee and shall be effective from that date until the next convention of state chapter.
- B. If the amount in the International Convention Fund exceeds the expenses of International Convention, the balance shall be kept in the International Convention Fund account. If the expenses of the International Convention exceed the amount in the International Convention Fund, the deficit shall be paid from the General Reserve Fund of the state chapter.
- C. A complete financial report of the International Convention Fund shall be posted at convention and printed in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

Section 4. EXECUTIVE BOARD AND COMMITTEES.

- A. The state chapter shall pay from the General Fund:
 - 1. All expenses incurred by the executive board in the transaction of official business. The allowance for mileage shall be in accordance with Internal Revenue Service guidelines and the amount determined each year. Should rates change, the executive board, after conferring with the finance committee, may decrease or increase the amount of reimbursement to align with IRS rates.
 - 2. All necessary expenses of the standing committees, and special committees as authorized by the executive board. The allowance for mileage shall be in accordance with Internal Revenue Service guidelines and the amount determined each year. The amount for the ensuing year will be included in the annual report of the Finance Committee and will be effective from that date until the next convention of state chapter.
 - 3. The cost of a past state president's recognition pin.
 - 4. The cost of auditing the accounts of the treasurer of state chapter by an auditor appointed by the executive board of state chapter.
 - 5. The cost of all additional items listed in the approved budget.
- B. The state chapter funds shall be placed in accounts fully secured and/or insured by the Federal Government and, when feasible, interest bearing.
- C. A quarterly report of the expenses of each state chapter office shall be submitted to the Finance Committee.
- D. A request by a board of directors, trustees or committee for contributions and/or assessments from members and/or local chapters must be approved by a unanimous vote of the executive board of state chapter.

ARTICLE IX - CO COTTEY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Section 1. ESTABLISHMENT. The state chapter shall establish a Colorado Cottey College Scholarship Fund within the P.E.O. Foundation. Scholarships shall be awarded annually to Cottey College students from Colorado. This fund shall be administered in keeping with the guidelines of the P.E.O. Foundation.

Section 2. FUNDING.

- A. Voluntary contributions from local chapters shall be accepted for this fund and sent to the treasurer of Colorado State Chapter who willforward to the P.E.O. Foundation. Tax-deductible contributions from individuals may be sent directly to the P.F.O. Foundation.
- B. Monies from excess state funds may be sent to the P.E.O. Foundation for this fund upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, approval of the executive board, and a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members of convention of state chapter.

Section 3. SCHOLARSHIPS.

- A. Scholarships may be granted annually based on the accumulated interest and fund principal in excess of a required minimum principal balance of five thousand dollars (\$5000.00) as reported by the P.E.O. Foundation.
- B. The following scholarships may be awarded annually in the following order listed below:
 - 1. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) shall honor a past state president and shall be awarded to a first-year student.
 - 2. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) shall be awarded to a second-year student in honor of Virginia Corbett, first president of Colorado State Chapter, 1903-1905.
 - 3. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be awarded to a third- year student in honor of the current Colorado state president.
 - 4. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be awarded to a fourth-year student in honor of Chellie Stevens Wright, past state president, Colorado State Chapter and President of Supreme Chapter 1937-1939.
 - 5. Additional scholarships may be awarded to any first, second, third, or fourth year students.
- C. Each recipient and the Financial Aid Director of Cottey College shall be notified following selection, and the names of recipients and amounts of awards shall be announced at convention of state chapter.

Section 4. APPLICATIONS. Applications for scholarship funds shall be sent to the candidates who have been accepted by Cottey College. The deadline for return of the completed application form shall be stated on the form to conform to P.E.O. Foundation requirements.

Section 5. ELIGIBILITY. Eligibility and selection procedures shall be approved by the executive board. Requirements are as follows:

- A. Applicants shall be a female Colorado resident.
- B. Candidates shall have been accepted for enrollment by Cottey College prior to scholarships being awarded.

Section 6. DISPOSITION OF FUND. If, by a three-fourths (3/4)) vote of two consecutive conventions of Colorado State Chapter, it is determined that the Colorado Cottey College Scholarship Fund held in the P.E.O. Foundation shall be discontinued, all assets of the fund shall be applied and distributed to a qualified charitable or educational project(s) in accordance with policies of the P.E.O. Foundation.

ARTICLE X - COLORADO STATE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Section 1. ESTABLISHMENT. The state chapter shall establish a Colorado State Scholarship Fund within the P.E.O. Foundation. Scholarships shall be awarded annually to women enrolled in accredited institutions of advanced learning and in keeping with the guidelines of the P.E.O. Foundation.

Section 2. FUNDING.

- A. Voluntary contributions from local chapters, individuals and/or bequests shall be accepted for this fund and sent to the treasurer of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. Monies from excess state funds may be sent to the P.E.O. Foundation for this fund upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, approval of the executive board, and a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members of convention of state chapter.

Section 3. SCHOLARSHIPS.

- A. One or more scholarships may be granted annually based on the accumulated interest and fund principal in excess of \$50,000.00 as reported by the P.E.O. Foundation.
- B. Scholarships shall be called the Colorado State Scholarship Award. One scholarship may be called the Colorado Past Presidents' Scholarship Award.
- C. Preference may be given for non-traditional or vocational areas of study.

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Section 4. ELIGIBILITY. Eligibility and selection procedures shall be approved by the executive board. Basic requirements are as follows:

- A. Colorado residency and U.S. citizenship.
- B. High school graduate or GED equivalency.
- C. No longer than two years past high school graduation or GED date.
- D. Submission of a completed application by the stated deadline on the form.

Section 5. DISPOSITION OF FUND. If, by three-fourths vote of two consecutive conventions of Colorado State Chapter, it is determined that the Colorado State Scholarship Fund held in the P.E.O. Foundation shall be discontinued, all assets of the fund shall be applied and distributed to a qualified charitable or educational project or projects in accordance with policies of the P.E.O. Foundation.

ARTICLE XI - ORGANIZATION AND OFFICIAL VISITS

Section 1. ORGANIZATION OF NEW CHAPTER.

(The following requirements are in addition to those listed in the Constitution, Part III, Article 1)

- A. Any person desiring to select a charter list for a new chapter shall contact the organizer of the state chapter before any action is taken.
- B. After approval to meet for the purpose of organizing a new chapter has been granted by the president of state chapter, with the approval of the executive board, the group shall hold a minimum of eight pre-organization meetings.
- C. Each prospective charter initiate shall have letters of recommendation from three active members of the Sisterhood sent to the organizer prior to organization.

Section 2. OFFICIAL VISITS TO LOCAL CHAPTERS.

A. An official visit shall be made every four years to each local chapter by the organizer or her proxy according to the Schedule for Official Visits published annually in the proceedings of convention of state chapter.

- B. An official visit shall be made to a new chapter the year following organization by the organizing officer or her proxy and the second and/or third year at the discretion of the organizer. Thereafter, the chapter shall be placed on the Schedule for Official Visits. Additional visits may be made when deemed appropriate by the executive board.
- C. The local chapter shall make provisions for housing and meals for the organizer or her proxy at the time of an official visit. If more than one chapter in an area is scheduled on the same visit, expenses may be pro-rated by those chapters.
- D. A local chapter may request an official visit any year.

ARTICLE XII - DUTIES OF LOCAL CHAPTER OFFICERS

The following duties are in addition to those listed in the Constitution, Part III, Article V, and in the Instructions to Officers of Local Chapters.

Section 1. PRESIDENT. The duties of President shall be:

- A. To appoint an auditing committee of at least two members.
- B. To write and send an annual letter to the president of state chapter in February and send a copy to the organizer of state chapter.
- C. To provide the current yearbook requirements for the chapter yearbook committee.
- D. To notify promptly the president of state chapter of the serious illness or death (including date) of a past state president who is a member of the chapter.

Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT. The duty of the Vice President shall be to act as International Projects Chairman of the chapter by:

- A. Updating project information annually.
- B. Striving to increase interest in the projects.
- C. Supervising the submitting of applications for project recipients.
- D. Supervising the submitting of names of prospective students to Cottey College.

Section 3. RECORDING SECRETARY. The duties of the Recording Secretary shall be:

- A. To send, by March 10, a completed copy of the local chapter bylaws and standing rules as instructed by the state executive board if the bylaws and/or standing rules were amended during the fiscal year.
- B. To send, by March 10, notification indicating "no change" as instructed by the state executive board if the local chapter bylaws and/or standing rules were not amended during the fiscal year.

Section 4. CORRESPONDING SECRETARY. The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be:

A. To send with chapter delegate to convention, copies of the local chapter yearbook for display. The number of required yearbooks to be stated on the Yearbook Requirements for Colorado Local Chapters each year.

Section 5. TREASURER. The duties of Treasurer shall be:

A. To pay to the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation all contributions received for that corporation, for Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, for Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund and the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund Christmas Shower.

B. To pay to the treasurer of the state chapter all contributions to the Colorado Cottey College Scholarship Fund and the Colorado State Scholarship Fund.

ARTICLE XIII - RECIPROCITY GROUPS

The following requirements are in addition to those listed in the Constitution, Part III, Article XIII.

Section 1. SUPERVISION. Each group formed shall be under the supervision of the vice president of the state chapter in compliance with the *Guidelines for Reciprocity Groups*.

Section 2. BYLAWS. Each group shall adopt bylaws consistent with the laws of the Sisterhood and the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter, with the approval of the vice president.

Section 3. ELECTION AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS. The annual election and installation of officers shall be held by June 15.

Section 4. UNAFFILIATE CHAIRMAN. Each group shall have an Unaffiliate Chairman who shall:

- A. Receive from a reciprocity representative of each chapter in the group, a report of chapter unaffiliate changes in order to maintain a current unaffiliate list.
- **B.** Report unaffiliate membership changes to the State Unaffiliate Chairman in order to maintain a current state unaffiliate list.
- C. Distribute, at each meeting, a copy of the current list of unaffiliates in the reciprocity area, to each representative in the group.

Section 5. REPORTS.

- A. Report of Election of Officers and contact person shall be submitted as required by International Chapter immediately following election.
- B. The financial report required by International Chapter shall be returned to the vice president of Colorado State Chapter by March 10.

ARTICLE XIV - P.E.O. GROUPS.

The following requirements are in addition to those stated in the Constitution, Part III, Article XIV.

Section 1. SUPERVISION. Each group shall be under the supervision of the vice president of the state chapter in compliance with the P.E.O. Group Book.

Section 2. BYLAWS. Each group shall adopt bylaws consistent with the laws of the Sisterhood and the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter, with the approval of the vice president. The president shall send a copy of the bylaws, if changed during the year, to the vice president of state chapter by May 1.

Section 3. MEETINGS. Meetings shall be indicated in the bylaws and yearbook of the group.

Section 4. FINANCE. P.E.O. Groups may have savings or other interest-bearing accounts.

Section 5. P.E.O. GROUP BOOK. Each group shall meet all reporting requirements contained in International Chapter's P.E.O. Group Requirements publication.

ARTICLE XV - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised,* shall govern all meetings in matters not covered by these bylaws, or the *Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules of the P.E.O. Sisterhood.*

ARTICLE XVI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. AMENDMENTS PROPOSED PRIOR TO CONVENTION.

A. Amendments to the bylaws and standing rules of the state chapter shall be proposed only by the executive board, board of directors, trustees, standing committees, or local chapters. Local chapters desiring to submit an amendment must have that proposal approved by a two-thirds vote at a regular business meeting, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at a previous regular business meeting and all absent resident members notified that a vote will be taken at the next regular business meeting. By February 1, proposed amendments shall be submitted in writing to the chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee.

B. Copies of proposed amendments, recommendations and/orresolutions to be voted on at convention of state chapter shall be sent by May 1 to members of the executive board, members of board of directors, trustees and standing committees, past presidents, each local chapter and the chairman of the Nominating Committee.

C. Proposed amendments may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting in convention of state chapter.

Section 2. AMENDMENTS PROPOSED DURING CONVENTION.

- A. Proposed amendments shall be submitted, in writing, to the chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee by any member of convention.
- B. Amendments may be called to the floor by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting in convention of state chapter.
- C. Such proposed amendments may be adopted by three-fourths vote of the members present and voting, provided the amendments shall have been read at a meeting prior to the one in which action is taken.

STANDING RULES

- 1. The requirements for local chapter yearbooks shall be determined by the executive board and published on the Colorado State Chapter website.
- 2. The name of a member whose death occurs after March 1 shall appear on the Memorial Roll at the convention of state chapter the following year.
- 3. All boards of directors, trustees and committees shall obtain approval of the president of state chapter before sending any form letters.
- 4. A gift of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be given each new local chapter at the time of organization.
- 5. The names, addresses with zip code, telephone numbers with area codes, and email addresses of current executive board members of Colorado State Chapter shall be posted on the Colorado website.
- 6. Area membership directories may be printed and distributed only with the express written permission of the Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter.

7. Amendments

- a. Amendments proposed prior to convention:
 - 1. Amendments to the standing rules shall be proposed only by the executive board, board of directors, trustees, standing committees, or local chapters.
 - 2. By February 1, proposed amendments shall be submitted in writing to the chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee.
 - 3. Copies of proposed amendments, recommendations and/or resolutions to be voted on at convention of state chapter shall be sent by May 1 to members of the executive board, members of board of directors, trustees and standing committees, past presidents, eachlocal chapter and the chairman of the Nominating Committee.
 - 4. Proposed amendments may be adopted by a majority vote of the members present and voting in convention of state chapter.
- b. Amendments proposed during convention:
 - 1. Proposed amendments shall be submitted, in writing, to the chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee by any member of convention.
 - 2. Amendments may be called to the floor by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting in convention of state chapter.
 - 3. Such proposed amendments may be adopted by two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, provided the amendments shall have been read at a meeting prior to the one in which action is taken.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION COLORADO P.E.O. CHARITABLE CORPORATION Amended June 4, 2016

Know all men by these presents: That we, Rachel Allen Upton, Gladys Thompson and Margaret Aldom, residents of the state of Colorado and Citizens of the United States of America, have associated ourselves for the purpose of forming a body corporate and politic, not for pecuniary profit under and by virtue of the laws and of the state of Colorado, and we do hereby make, execute and acknowledge this certificate in writing of our intention so to become a body corporate under and by virtue of said laws.

First. The name of our said corporation shall be Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Second. The objects and purposes for which our said corporation is formed and incorporated are:

- A. To establish a fund to receive contributions, membership dues, gifts and bequests for the philanthropic, benevolent, charitable and nonprofit benefit of members of the Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (and members of their families and other non-members as further described in the following section (B) of this Second article). Such funds to be allowed to accumulate toward the acquisition of a home for P.E.O. members, the operation of which shall qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or any corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law) (the "Code").
- B. To establish, maintain and operate in the state of Colorado a home for the benefit of members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (including members of their families who meet criteria established by the corporation), who may desire to live in such a home. This will not preclude the corporation, if and to the extent deemed reasonable, necessary and prudent by the corporation's board of directors based upon the economic practicalities of operating such a home for such purposes, from providing residency in the home to persons who are not members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (or qualifying members of the families), but who are sponsored by a P.E.O. sister. If this is done, preference for residency in the home shall be given first to members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, second to qualifying members of their families and third to persons who are not members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (or qualifying members of their families) but who are sponsored by a P.E.O. Sister.
- C. To erect, build or otherwise procure a suitable building or buildings for the aforesaid purpose.
- D. To acquire by gift, bequest, devise, purchase, lease or otherwise, all kinds of property, both real and personal.

- E. To own, hold, sell and convey, exchange, lease, mortgage and encumber and otherwise dispose of all kinds of property, both real and personal.
- F. To borrow money and make, execute and deliver promissory notes or other forms of indebtedness therefore and make, execute and deliver security thereof on real or personal property.
- G. To invest and reinvest funds of the corporation in all kinds of real and personal property, including bonds, stocks and other forms of securities.
- H. To do and perform all acts and things which may be deemed necessary or expedient for the proper and successful prosecution of the objects and purposes for which the corporation is created.

Third. The corporation shall be non-stock and no dividends nor pecuniary profits shall be declared.

Fourth. Every member of the Colorado State Chapter, P.E.O. Sisterhood in good standing shall be a member of this corporation.

Fifth.

- A. Board of Directors. The management of the affairs of the corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in the Colorado Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "Act"), these Articles of Incorporation, or the bylaws of the corporation. The number of directors, their classifications, if any, their terms of office, and the manner of their election or appointment shall be determined according to the bylaws of the corporation from time to time in force.
- B. Liability of Directors. No director shall be personally liable to the corporation for monetary damages for any breach of fiduciary duty as a director, except that the foregoing shall not eliminate or limit such director's duty of loyalty to the corporation for monetary damages for any of the following: (1) any breach of such director's duty of loyalty to the corporation, (2) any of such director's acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law, (3) acts specified in Section 7-128-403 of the Act, as it now exists or hereafter may be amended, regarding a director's assent to or participation in the making of any loan by the corporation to any director or officer of the corporation, or (4) any transaction from which such director derived an improper personal benefit. If the Act hereafter is amended to authorize the further elimination of the liability of directors,

then the liability of a director of the corporation in addition to the limitation on personal liability provided herein, shall be further eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by the Act. Any repeal or modification of this Article V (B) shall be prospective only and shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director of the corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

Sixth. The annual meeting of this corporation shall be held at the Convention of Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood. The time and place shall be designated in the convention program. A majority of the members of said convention shall constitute a quorum. The voting members of this corporation shall be the members of the annual convention of the Colorado State Chapter and the directors of the corporation.

Seventh. The principal office of said corporation shall be located in the City of Colorado Springs, and the County of El Paso, State of Colorado.

Eighth. The directors shall have power to make such prudential bylaws as they deem proper for the management of the affairs of this corporation according to the laws in such case made and provided.

Ninth. The term of existence of this corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

Tenth.

- A. The corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (b) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Code.
 - A. No part of the net earnings of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder, member or individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Second article herein.
 - B. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, lobbying, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in any political campaign on behalf of oragainst any candidate for political office.

Eleventh.

- A. In the event of dissolution of this corporation, the assets remaining after the donors' requests have been met shall be distributed for charitable purposes only to charitable organizations which are exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the **Code.** Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed by the Court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purpose.
- B. No member, director, or officer of the corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporation assets upon dissolution of the corporation.

COLORADO P.E.O. CHARITABLE CORPORATION BYLAWS Amended June 5, 2021

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation shall be Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

ARTICLE II - ESTABLISHING ACT

The Colorado Foundation Fund of the P.E.O. Sisterhood was incorporated as a Colorado corporation on July 20, 1949 under Colorado Secretary of State's document number 116747 (later renumbered as 19871180800). On July 2, 1963 under Colorado Secretary of State's document number 167369, the Articles of Incorporation were amended to (1) include among the objects and purposes of the corporation the receipt of funds for the philanthropic, benevolent, charitable, and non- profit benefit of members of the Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, and (2) establish the corporation as a not for profit corporation. On July 2, 1965, under Colorado Secretary of State's document number 180800, the Articles of Incorporation were amended to change the name of the corporation to Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, Inc. On July 6, 2012, under Colorado Secretary of State's document number 20121371156, the Articles of Incorporation were amended to change the name of the corporation to Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

ARTICLE III - OBJECT AND PURPOSE

The primary, but not sole, object and purpose of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be to receive contributions, membership dues, gifts and bequests for the philanthropic, benevolent, charitable and non-profit benefit of members of the Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, and non-members within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or any corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law (the "Code"). The primary activities of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall include but not be limited to a) maintaining and operating a home **for independent living** (hereinafter called Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House) for the benefit of members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, qualifying members of their families, and persons who are not members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood but who are sponsored by a P.E.O. and meet the criteria established by the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation and b) maintaining and operating the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund to provide assistance to Colorado P.E.O. members and non-

members.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERS

Members in good standing of Colorado State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, hereinafter referred to as Colorado State Chapter, are members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

ARTICLE V - CORPORATION MEETINGS

Section 1. Annual Meeting.

- A. Time and Place. The annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be held at the Convention of Colorado State Chapter. The time and place of the annual meeting shall be designated in the convention program. Notice of the time and place of the annual meeting shall be sent to each local chapter by the Board of Directors of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation by May 1.
- B. Quorum. A majority of members of convention of Colorado State Chapter shall constitute a quorum.
- C. Voting. If a quorum exists, action on a matter is approved if the votes cast favoring the action exceed the votes cast opposing the action, unless approval by a greater number of votes is required by law, Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation's Articles of Incorporation, or these bylaws.
- D. Voting Members. The voting members of this corporation shall be the voting members of the annual convention of Colorado State Chapter and the directors of the Corporation.

Section 2. Special Meetings.

- A. Procedure to Call
 - Special meetings of the members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable
 Corporation may be called by the chairman or a majority of the Board
 of Directors with the authorization of the Executive Board of Colorado State
 Chapter or Convention of Colorado State Chapter.
 - Members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation representing 15% of the P.E.O. Chapters in Colorado may call a special meeting. No chapter shall initiate the circulation necessary to call a special meeting without first obtaining authorization of the Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter or Convention of Colorado State Chapter.
- 3. Time and Place. The Board of Directors shall determine the time and place of

- the special meeting. If not held in conjunction with the convention of Colorado State Chapter, thirty days' notice of the time, place and purpose of such special meeting shall be sent by the Board of Directors to each local chapter entitled to vote at the last annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.
- 4. Expenses. Expenses incurred by the Board of Directors and the cost of the meeting facility, printing and mailing shall be paid by the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation will not be responsible for any other expenses pertaining to the special meeting.
- 5. Quorum and Manner of Voting. A majority of votes entitled to be cast by members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation on a matter shall constitute a quorum for action on that matter. If a quorum exists, action on a matter is approved if the votes cast favoring the action exceed the votes cast opposing the matter, unless approval by greater number of votes is required by law, Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or these bylaws.

ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Number of Directors.

Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be administered by a Board of Directors of seven voting members. Four members shall be elected by the members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, one of whom, when feasible, shall be a past president of Colorado State Chapter. The president of Colorado State Chapter, the chairman of the Chapter House Trustees (as defined below) and the chairman of the Marguerite Fund Trustees (as defined below) shall serve as ex-officio members. In the absence of the Chapter House Trustees chairman and/or the Marguerite Fund Trustees chairman, another trustee from their respective entities shall serve as an ex-officio member having a vote. The vice president of Colorado State Chapter shall serve as an ex-officio member having a vote in the absence of the president of Colorado State Chapter.

Section 2. Qualifications and Term of Directors.

Any member of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation is eligible to serve on the Board of Directors. A term shall be a period of four years commencing at the first regular meeting following the annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. No person shall serve as an elected member for more than one consecutive four-year term. A director appointed pursuant to Section 5 below who serves a term of more than one year shall not be eligible for election to the Board of Directors in the year following expiration of

her appointed term.

Section 3. Nomination of Directors.

- A. Nomination of directors shall be by a nominating committee appointed by the president of Colorado State Chapter. The committee shall consist of a past state president of Colorado State Chapter who will serve as chairman, and two active resident members of Colorado State Chapter.
- B. By April 1, the name of the nominees and appropriate information about the nominees shall be forwarded to the chairman of the Board of Directors by the nominating committee.
- C. The names of the nominees and appropriate information shall be sent to each local chapter by the Board of Directors by May 1.
- D. At the time of the election, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. Consent of all nominees must be obtained.
- E. All expenses of the nominating committee shall be paid by Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 4. Election of Directors.

- A. In a year a vacancy for a past president of Colorado State Chapter may be filled, if there is but one nominee for that vacancy, election shall be by voice vote. If more than one nominee is presented, election shall be by ballot.
- B. Election to fill the second vacancy shall be by ballot unless only one nominee is presented, in which case, election shall be by voice vote.
- C. When the number of nominees is greater than the number of vacancies, election shall be by ballot, otherwise a voice vote shall be taken. The two nominees who receive the highest number of votes cast shall be elected.

Section 5. Interim Vacancy.

An interim vacancy of the Board of Directors shall be filled by appointment by the president of Colorado State Chapter on recommendation of the nominating committee.

Section 6. Meetings and Quorum.

- A. Attendance. All meetings of the Board of Directors shall be open unless executive session is requested. A visitor is requested to notify the Board Chairman of his/her intent to be present at a meeting.
- B. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings shall be held when necessary but not less than once quarterly. Date, time and place of regular meetings shall be set by the chairman. Notice of each meeting shall be mailed, emailed or faxed to each

- director at least ten days prior to the date of the meeting. Five voting directors shall constitute a quorum.
- C. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or two members. Each director shall be notified by mail, email or fax of the date, time, place and purpose of such special meeting at least five days prior to the date of the meeting. Five voting directors shall constitute a quorum.
- D. Emergency Meetings. Emergency meetings may be called by any director when immediate and unexpected action must be taken. Notice of an emergency meeting may be made without written notice and requires no specific period of previous notice so long as a reasonable attempt is made to reach each director. Emergency action may be taken at such meeting or by telephone conference by any four voting directors.
- E. Voting. A vote of the majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Board of Directors. No director may vote or act by proxy at any meeting of the directors.

ARTICLE VII OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers.

Officers shall be chairman, vice-chairman, secretary and treasurer. Each officer shall be a member of the Board of Directors. Such other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Duties of Officers.

- A. Chairman. The chairman shall, subject to the direction and supervision of the Board of Directors, be the chief executive officer of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The chairman has the authority to table a discussion for future consideration, unless at that time a vote is called.
- B. Vice Chairman. The vice chairman shall in general, and in the absence of the chairman, perform all duties incident to the office of chairman and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- C. Secretary. The secretary shall prepare and maintain as permanent records the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and a record of all actions taken by the Board of Directors without a meeting.
- D. Treasurer. The treasurer shall, subject to the direction and supervision of the Board of Directors, be the principal financial officer of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, shall oversee the care and custody of all funds, securities, evidences of indebtedness and other personal property of Colorado

P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 3. Election.

Election of officers shall be held at the first regular meeting following the annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. Outgoing members shall be present without vote. The director serving as chairman at the last annual meeting shall preside.

Section 4. Term of Office.

A term of office shall be one year. No director may serve in the same office more than two (2) consecutive terms. The term of office shall begin immediately following election.

Section 5. Vacancy in Office.

Any vacancy in office shall be filled by election of the Board of Directors for the remainder of the unexpired term.

ARTICLE VIII COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman with the approval of the Board of Directors. The chairman shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In no case shall any committee have the authority to act for the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX FINANCE

Section 1. Reimbursement of Expenses.

Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall pay all expenses incurred by members of the Board of Directors and committees in performing the duties relating to the operation and management of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. The allowance for mileage will be consistent with the Colorado State Executive Board policy.

Section 2. Expenditures, Loans and Encumbrances.

Approval by written ballot by two-thirds of the votes cast at the annual meeting or at a special meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be required for:

- A. Expenditure of funds for the acquisition or improvement of real or personal property or incurrence of obligation for same, when the total amount involved is in excess of \$100,000.
- B. Placement of a loan of any kind or character, secured or unsecured or both, and/or placement of any encumbrance against real or personal property when the total amount of such a loan or loans is in excess of \$100,000.

C. Sale of real property.

Section 3. Annual Audit.

The treasurer shall send a copy of the annual audit of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation to the president of Colorado State Chapter.

ARTICLE X COLORADO P.E.O. CHAPTER HOUSE

Section 1. Purpose.

The Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall operate and maintain the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, an independent living residence, so long as financially sustainable, for the benefit of members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (including members of their families who meet criteria established by the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation), who may desire to reside in such a home. This will not preclude the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, if and to the extent deemed reasonable, necessary and prudent by the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation's Board of Directors based upon the economic practicalities of operating such a home for such purposes, from providing residency in the home to persons who are not members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (or qualifying members of their families), but who are sponsored by a P.E.O. sister. If this is done, preference for residency in the home shall be given as a residence first for members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, second to qualifying members of their families, and third to persons who are not members of the P.E.O. Sisterhood (or qualifying members of their families) but who are sponsored by a P.E.O. sister. If the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House residence should be sold, the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House project may continue without dissolution.

Section 2. Administration.

The Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House shall be administered, subject to the direction and supervision of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, by a group of three (3) trustees, hereinafter called the Chapter House Trustees.

Section 3. Appointment.

The Chapter House Trustees shall consist of three (3) members, one of whom, when feasible, shall be a past president of Colorado State Chapter. Any member of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation is eligible to serve as a Chapter House Trustee. A term for Chapter House Trustees shall be a period of three (3) years, and no person shall serve consecutive terms. The president of Colorado State Chapter shall, with the approval of the executive board, appoint one Chapter House Trustee each year. The senior member in point of service shall be the chairman of the Chapter House Trustees. If an entirely new group of Chapter House Trustees must be appointed, the president of

Colorado State Chapter shall designate the chairman, the second and third member who shall serve one, two and three years, respectively. An interim vacancy of the Chapter House Trustees shall be filled by appointment by the president of Colorado State Chapter with the approval of the executive board. A Trustee who has been appointed to fill out a vacancy may serve an additional three (3) year appointment.

Section 4. Meetings.

- A. Attendance. All meetings of the Chapter House Trustees shall be open unless executive session is requested. A visitor is requested to notify the chairman of the Chapter House Trustees of his/her intent to be present at a meeting.
- B. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings shall be held when necessary but not less than once quarterly. Date, time and place of regular meetings shall be set by the chairman. Notice of each meeting shall be mailed, emailed or faxed to each Chapter House Trustee at least ten days prior to the date of the meeting. Two of the three Chapter House Trustees shall constitute a quorum.
- C. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or two Chapter House Trustees. Each Chapter House Trustee shall be notified by mail, email or fax of the date, time, place and purpose of such special meeting at least five days prior to the date of the meeting. Two of the three Chapter House Trustees shall constitute a quorum.
- D. Emergency Meetings. Emergency meetings may be called by any Chapter House Trustee when immediate and unexpected action must be taken regarding the management of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House. Notice of an emergency meeting may be made by mail, email, fax or telephone without written notice and requires no specific period of previous notice so long as a reasonable attempt is made to reach each Chapter House Trustee. Emergency action may be taken at such meeting or by telephone conference by any two Chapter House Trustees.
- E. Voting. A vote of the majority of the Chapter House Trustees present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Chapter House Trustees. No Chapter House Trustee may vote or act by proxy at any meeting of the Chapter House Trustees.

Section 5. Officers.

Officers shall be chairman, vice chairman and secretary. Each officer shall be a Chapter House Trustee.

Section 6. Finance.

A. Annual Dues. Any allocation per active member of Colorado State Chapter

- collected for Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House by the treasurer of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be allocated specifically for the operations of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House.
- B. Voluntary Contributions. Any voluntary contributions collected for Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House by the treasurer of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall be allocated specifically for the operations of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House unless otherwise specified in the gift document.
- C. Rent and Other Income. Any amounts received by or for the benefit of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House for rent, usage fees or other income shall be allocated specifically for the operations of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House.
- D. Reimbursement of Expenses. Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation shall pay all expenses incurred by members of the Chapter House Trustees in performing the duties relating to the operation and management of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House. The allowance for mileage will be consistent with the Colorado state executive board policy.

Section 9. Closing and Sale of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House Residence.

A resolution presented by either of the following parties shall be subject to the approval of **two-thirds** of the votes cast at an annual **or special** meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation:

- A. Resolution by Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may adopt a resolution recommending that Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence be closed and sold**.
- B. Resolution by Members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. Members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation representing 15% of the P.E.O. Chapters in Colorado may present a resolution to **close and sell** the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence** at any annual meeting of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, provided that the necessary circularization has been obtained from the executive board of the Colorado State Chapter or Convention of Colorado State Chapter.
- C. This Section operates outside the parameters of the preamble set forth in Section 9, in that it pertains to specific circumstances. The Board of Directors shall adopt a resolution recommending that the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House residence be closed and sold if there is a major catastrophic event... event (including, but not limited to, fire, flood, blizzard, etc.) which prevents residential occupancy for six or more months. This resolution will be presented at the earliest annual meeting of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation and will become effective with a majority vote of that annual meeting.
- D. Disbursements of Assets. If closed and sold, all proceeds of the sale of the assets of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House residence shall be **held in the Chapter**

House operating fund of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation for future use as approved by the membership and consistent with the CPCC Articles of Incorporation. Any remaining residents will be assisted in finding new housing. Any residents utilizing the Share the Care Program for two years or longer will continue to receive assistance in the same amount with time guidelines decided upon by the Board of Directors at the time of closing, provided that funds are available.

ARTICLE XI SHARE THE CARE FUND

Section 1. Purpose.

A fund entitled Share the Care was established by Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House, Inc. in 1968 through action of the Board of Trustees. Support by the membership was confirmed at the following convention of Colorado State Chapter when a contribution of \$1,000 was given from Colorado State Chapter funds. Share the Care Fund was established to provide assistance for Chapter House residents whose financial position impedes residency at Chapter House. **Section 2. Funding.**

Voluntary contributions to Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation designated for the Share the Care Fund, from any source, shall be processed and deposited into an account designated for Share the Care funds. Contributions to Share the Care are deductible by donors in computing taxes imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

Section 3. Administration.

- A. Application. Applications shall be available through the Chapter House manager or any current trustee. Completed applications shall be sent to the chairman of Chapter House Trustees. Applications shall be considered by a committee of three appointed by the chairman of Chapter House Trustees.
- B. Distribution of funds is made directly to the operating funds of Chapter House for the account of recipient resident(s) by the treasurer of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 4. Fund Assets.

Share the Care assets shall be used only to subsidize resident fees. The financial records and accounts of this fund shall be kept separate and apart from the books and accounts of other funds of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation and shall be listed separately on **financial** reports.

Section 5. Closing and Sale of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House Residence and Further Use of Share the Care Fund Assets.

If the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence** is **closed and sold** pursuant to Section 9 of Article X, the assets of the Share the Care Fund are to be used to provide assistance to those who were residing at the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence** when it was **closed** and further to make distributions or otherwise provide financial assistance to individuals in need who are residing in facilities similar to the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House residence, consistent to the extent possible with the purpose of the Share the Care Fund above in **Section 1. of this Article XI.** If the foregoing uses of the Share the Care Fund assets no longer become possible, in the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, the assets of the Share the Care Fund are to be used for any of the charitable purposes of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

ARTICLE XII ENDOWMENT FUND

Section 1. Purpose.

The Endowment Fund provides funds to be invested for support of the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House. Earnings and growth can be used for designated purposes in the operations according to policy of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 2. Funding.

Voluntary contributions to Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation designated for the **Endowment Fund** from any source shall be processed and deposited into an account designated for the **Endowment Fund**. Contributions to the **Endowment Fund** are deductible by donors in computing taxes imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

Section 3. Administration.

The **Endowment Fund** shall be invested according to the investment policy of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation. The financial records and accounts of this fund shall be kept separate and apart from the books and accounts of other funds of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation and shall be listed separately on financial reports.

Section 4. Closing and Sale of Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House Residence and Further Use of Endowment Fund Assets.

If the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence** is **closed and sold** pursuant to Section 9 of Article X, the assets of the Endowment Fund are to be used to provide assistance to those who were residing at the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence** when it was **closed** and further to make distributions or otherwise provide financial assistance to individuals in need who are residing in assisted living facilities or facilities similar to the Colorado P.E.O. Chapter House **residence**, consistent to the extent possible with the

initial establishment of the Endowment Fund above in **Section 1 of this Article XII**. If the foregoing uses of the Endowment Fund assets no longer become possible, in the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, the assets of the Endowment Fund are to be used for any of the charitable purposes of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

ARTICLE XIII COLORADO P.E.O. MARGUERITE FUND

Section 1. Purpose.

The Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund shall be maintained to provide assistance to Colorado P.E.O. members and nonmembers.

Section 2. Administration.

The Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund shall be administered, subject to the direction and supervision of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation Board of Directors, by a group of trustees, hereinafter called the Marguerite Fund Trustees.

Section 3. Appointment.

The Marguerite Fund Trustees shall consist of three (3) members, one of whom, when feasible, shall be a past president of Colorado State Chapter. Any member of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation is eligible to serve as a Marguerite Fund Trustee. Each Marguerite Fund Trustee shall serve for three (3) years. The president of Colorado State Chapter shall, with the approval of the executive board, appoint one Marguerite Fund Trustee each year. The senior member in point of service shall be the chairman of the Marguerite Fund Trustees. If an entirely new group of Marguerite Fund Trustees must be appointed, the president of Colorado State Chapter shall designate the chairman, the second and third member who shall serve one, two and three years, respectively. An interim vacancy of the Marguerite Fund Trustees shall be filled by appointment by the president of Colorado State Chapter with the approval of the executive board.

Section 4. Meetings.

Members of the Marguerite Fund Trustees shall meet at the call of the chairman.

Section 5. Finance.

- A. Voluntary Contributions. This fund shall be supported by voluntary contributions sent to the treasurer of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.
- B. Christmas Shower. Local chapters, assigned in alphabetical groups, may be asked to contribute to the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund Christmas Shower.

- C. Reimbursement of Expenses. All expenses of the Marguerite Fund Trustees shall be paid by Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.
- D. Investment of Funds. Funds shall be invested in secure investments such as certificates of deposit and money markets where there is no loss of principal.

Section 6. Application Procedure.

- A. Application. An application for assistance, which includes a case history and financial summary, may be secured from any member of the Marguerite Fund Trustees or from the Colorado State Chapter website by any member of a chapter.
- B. Approval. An application for assistance, completed and signed by the applicant, may be recommended for payment by Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation only upon unanimous approval by the Marguerite Fund Trustees.
- C. Renewal. All recipient applications must be updated and reviewed in order to be renewed.
- D. Sponsor. All applicants are required to have a Colorado P.E.O. sponsor.

Section 7. Financial Assistance.

- A. Monthly Allowance. An applicant may be recommended for an allowance not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) monthly for one year.
- B. One-time assistance. Any applicant may be recommended for one grant not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) within any twelve-month period.
- C. Emergency assistance, approved by the Board of Directors of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation, after consultation with the Marguerite Fund Trustees shall not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) annually.
- D. Discontinuation of Assistance. The Marguerite Fund Trustees shall, upon the written recommendation of a recipient's sponsor, discontinue assistance.

Section 8. Visits/Contact.

One or more members of the Marguerite Fund Trustees may visit/contact each recipient when feasible.

Section 9. Dissolution of the Fund.

- A. Vote. The Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund may be dissolved at an annual or special meeting of the Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation when approved by a two- thirds vote of members present and voting.
- B. Disbursement of Assets. If dissolved, all assets of the Colorado P.E.O. Marguerite Fund shall be disbursed to the general funds of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable

Corporation.

ARTICLE XIV PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised, shall govern Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules of the P.E.O. Sisterhood, and the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Colorado State Chapter.

ARTICLE XV AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Bylaws.

- A. Proposal of Amendments. Amendments to the bylaws of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation may be proposed by any local chapter, the Board of Directors, the Chapter House or Marguerite Fund Trustees, or the Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter. Proposed amendments shall be submitted in writing to the chairman of the Board of Directors by November 1 of each year. Proposed amendments shall be sent by the Board of Directors by January 1 to the State Executive Board for circularization permission.
- B. Distribution to Members. Copies of the proposed amendments and resolutions to be voted on at the annual corporate meeting shall be sent by the Board of Directors to each local chapter and other members of convention eligible to vote at the annual corporate meeting during convention by May 1.
- C. Approval. Proposed amendments shall be subject to the approval by two-thirds of the votes cast at the annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Section 2. Articles of Incorporation.

- A. Proposal of Amendments. Members of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation may adopt a resolution setting forth proposed amendments to the Articles of Incorporation in accordance with the Colorado Non-profit Corporation Act provided that the authorization for the necessary circularization has been obtained from the Executive Board of Colorado State Chapter or convention of Colorado State Chapter. Amendments shall be submitted in writing to the chairman of the Board of Directors by November 1. Proposed amendments shall be sent by the Board of Directors by January 1 to the State Executive Board for circularization permission.
- B. Distribution to Members. Copies of the proposed amendments and resolutions to be voted on at the annual corporate meeting shall be sent by the Board of

- Directors to each local chapter and other members of convention eligible to vote at the annual corporate meeting during convention by May 1.
- C. Approval. Proposed amendments shall be subject to the approval by two-thirds of the votes cast at the annual meeting of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

D. ARTICLE XVI DISSOLUTION

F. A resolution presented by either of the following parties shall be subject to the approval of three-fourths of the votes cast at two consecutive annual meetings of Colorado P.E.O. Charitable Corporation.

Charitable Corporation, provided that the necessary circularization has been obtained from the Executive Board of the Colorado State Chapter or Convention of Colorado State Chapter.
