Emerge from the Cocoon

P.E.O.s are like Butterflies

P.E.O. is emerging from the pandemic cocoon. When we think of cocoons, we think of butterflies. Throughout the world's cultures, butterflies symbolize endurance, change hope and life. They also represent creativity, freedom, love and personal development. Our sisters have the same qualities as butterflies described above.

Some butterflies are more colorful that others due to their wing's scale structure. Iridescence comes from light reflecting on those scales. P.E.O. members reflect the light of each other and make the whole shine. Each chapter is different just as there are about 24,000 different species of butterflies.

A butterfly has four separate wings and P.E.O. has four leadership levels – International, state/province/district, chapter and member. A butterfly has six legs; P.E.O. has six projects we support. A butterfly goes through four stages in its life cycle – egg to caterpillar to

pupa/chrysalis to adult. As a new member, weren't you like the caterpillar "eating" up all the knowledge you could about P.E.O.? Then you morphed into a sister with enough knowledge to hold a chapter office or serve as a committee chair.

This new year, take the challenge to: *Actively grow your chapter with new members. Sponsoring a new chapter would be like creating a new butterfly.

- * Keep in touch with nonparticipating members to interest them in attending meetings again. Get them to unfold their wings and rejoin the group.
